Early Literacy Success School District Grants

- What: Non-competitive, application-based, annual grant-in-aid
- Who: School districts and eligible public charter schools that are elementary schools
- Why: To support comprehensive early literacy plans that are researchbased and culturally responsive
- When: Application deadline January 8, 2024
- **How Much:** \$90 million for the 2023-25 biennium funded through the Statewide Education Initiatives Account



Early Literacy Success School District Grants

- Allowable uses include:
- **Professional development and coaching** in research-aligned literacy strategies for teachers and administrators in early elementary grades.
- Extended learning programs that use research-aligned literacy strategies and that are made available to students in early elementary grades by licensed teachers or by qualified tutors; including:
 - O Home-based summer reading activities for students who need additional support and enrichment;
 - O and **Intensive summer school program**s for students who need the most additional support and who receive at least 60 hours of direct literacy instruction by an instructional assistant or a licensed teacher trained in research-aligned literacy strategies.
- High-dosage tutoring that integrates reading and writing and is delivered by a qualified tutor.
- The adoption and implementation of curricula that uses **research-aligned literacy strategies**.
- **Literacy specialists, coaches or interventionists** to support all of the above



Early Literacy Plan

- Our application for the Early Literacy Success School District Grant covers the initial 2023-2025 biennium and was submitted on December 28, 2023.
- Our initial allocation amount for '23-'24 is \$53,242.60 and for '24-'25 is \$55,415.76 for a total of \$108,658.36





Early Literacy Program Review

- Strengths:
 - Meet required number of literacy instructional minutes K-5 (90 minutes of core literacy, 30 minutes of Fundations/daily)
 - Literacy intervention time built into schedule (10-30 minutes/daily)
 - K-5 Literacy Adopted Curriculum that is based in Science of Reading and ODE approved
 - K-5 Literacy Coach
- Improvement Areas:
 - Number of proficient readers needs to increase
 - Minimal before/after school and summer literacy instruction through the district.



Professional Development & Coaching

Current Practices:

- All teachers and many instructional assistants attended back to school PD for effectively implementing new literacy curriculum.
- Many K-5 teachers are enrolled in LETRS training to learn more about the Science of Reading and implementing best practices
- K-5 Literacy coach works with teachers to support students and instruction

Plan for Grant:

- O Budgeted to pay stipends for teachers who have attended LETRS trainings
- Budgeted to pay for subs so teachers can plan and meet with Literacy
 Coach



Extended Learning Programs

- Current Practices:
 - O At this time, we have minimal before/after school instruction or summer programming offered through the district
- Plan for Grant:
 - Budgeted to pay teachers to provide before/after school literacy instruction
 - Budgeted to pay teachers to provide summer programming.
 - Budgeted to purchase materials for summer (in home) summer programming



High Dosage Tutoring

- Current Practices:
 - O At this time, we have literacy intervention time built in to our schedule
- Plan For Grant:
 - We requested more funds be allocated so we may pay for teachers to be paid for time to strategically identify students to be referred for literacy intervention.



Research Aligned Curriculum

- Current Practices:
 - O At this time, we have adopted a K-5 Literacy curriculum aligns to the grant requirements. We also have adopted a K-3 phonics program that aligns to the grant requirements.
- Plan for Grant:
 - Budgeted to purchase additional materials for classroom literacy instruction and intervention



Communication Plan

Current Practices:

 We communicate with parents and stakeholders through various means including newsletters, print, and social media. Feedback from stakeholders from Integrated Guidance and Strategic Improvement Planning is/will be considered.

Plan For Grant:

- There are no funds associated with improving communication of the district's literacy plan
- As we learn of gaps in communication, we work to improve them.



Student Growth Assessment

- Current Practices:
 - We measure student growth through various assessments. These include DIBELS, ESGI, ELPA, and OSAS
- Plan For Grant:
 - At this time, we are not budgeting from the grant to add additional assessments for students.



Matching Funds

- For the purpose of the grant, we only have to report we are match spending
 25% of our allocation amount from a source outside the grant.
- 25% match would be \$13,310.65 in '23-'24 & \$13,853.94 in '24-'25. We spend a
 lot more than this on K-5 literacy instruction our of the General Fund, Title, and
 other grants.
- Plan For Grant:
 - We reported the general fund cost of our K-5 literacy coach as the match fund requirement.
