
## Browning Public Schools Activities Report December 2021-January 2022

Police gave her a warning and told her to leave in which she did only to return. This time her and her husband showed up at the same place and talked to the boys again.

The event got over and everybody went to Denny's outside of Great Falls by the airport. While waiting for their order some students went into the gas station and was buying some snacks for the ride home. The same woman and her husband showed up at Denny's and began threatening the boys again. Police were called again, I was notified again, and I called the Great Falls police department @1:04 am to make sure our students were safe in case anything should happen on the road home. Police interviewed a few students at the event and at Denny's, they also interviewed the supervisor Mr. Tail. Police assured me their safety, parents were pressing charges the following Monday, and in case of any emergency to call 911.

I notified my supervisor both times of the incidents.
