Northome Principal's Report: I would like to welcome our new school nurse, Annette. Annette started with us on Monday and jumped right in. She has had a busy week with COVID! Our top finalists from grades 5-8 will travel to Indus next Wednesday for the district spelling bee. The PBIS theme this month is Respect. Respect yourself, others, and our school. We

I am always looking for fun and exciting events and opportunities to bring to our local area.
