In 2014 -2015, the state of Oregon went away from the OAKS assessment to the Smarter Balanced Assessment. The Smarter Balanced test uses a new scoring system. The scoring system uses a scale that is broken down into levels 1-4. For some students, their scores may appear lower than they were in the past. A drop in scores does not mean a student is doing worse in school. The state has simply raised the bar to ensure students receive the support they need to graduate.

The 2014-2015 results are in and our assessment score are better than the state anticipated. However, there is still a lot of work to be done in the area of English Language Arts, Math and Writing. During parent teacher

conferences, November 4th and 5th, your child's individual student report will be available for you to pick up.


