Parade of Penguins at Evergreen Elementary

The third grade classes at Evergreen Elementary School created virtual life-size penguins in a workshop coordinated by the Illinois River Valley Arts Council (IRVAC) Learning Through Art (LTA) Program on November 20.

There are 17 species of penguin, which all live in the Southern Hemisphere (south of the equator). They live in climates ranging from the warm tropics to the frigid Antarctic.

Penguins don't live near fresh water, so drink salt water. They have a special gland in their bodies that takes the salt out of the water they drink and pushes it out of grooves in their bill. Their body is built for efficient swimming with their average speed in the water being about 15 miles per hour.

The Emperor Penguin is the largest penguin, with adults ranging from 3.5 to 4 feet tall, and weighing from 65 to 80 pounds. The Emperor penguin is the only species that breeds and nests in Antarctica through the frigid winter.

The students created three foot tall "paper doll" Emperor penguins, using templates. They traced and cut out their penguins, then drew in the markings, and completed the penguins by painting them. These penguins will be decorating the gym for the Winter Program.

The workshops were conducted by LTA Evergreen Coordinator Patti Culver, and assisted in Ms. Brandt's class by volunteer Della Meengs.

ADVERSE WEATHER CONDITIONS

Straight Line Routes For:

Illinois Valley, Lorna Byrne, Evergreen

In the event of adverse weather conditions parents are advised to tune in to Radio Stations KRWQ, KAJO, KLDR, KBOY and TV Stations KOBI (5), KDRV (12), KTVL (10) or the 3 Rivers School District Web Page for information on school bus schedules.

Sometimes weather conditions leave some roads blocked or unsafe to travel but school is still being held. Under these circumstances "straight line routes" will be run. This is the information you will get on the web page or radio/TV stations.

When straight line routes are run the roads affected are listed below.

If you live on one of the roads the buses cannot travel, you may bring your student to the nearest intersection of the main road traveled. This will also be the stop for the afternoon drop off.
