The new year has gotten off to a good start. Staff are working on setting and maintaining consistent expectations for behavior, attendance, and academics. We have changed our schedule so that our advisory class is after 2<sup>nd</sup> period and changed the focus to advisory/powerblock. During this class we will not only incorporate DESSA and grade/attendance monitoring, but also provide enhancement and support for all students in ELA and Math. We are also focusing on writing at BMS. Each of the content areas will have a minimum of 1 writing assignment per quarter. During the first quarter we will be working on the writing process. How to organize a paragraph then write. This is based on the need for improvement in organization skills shown in reviewing our district writing assessment results from 2024-25.

Our first full week included dress up days and many students, as well as staff, participated.

We do have some students who started late and that has dropped our percentages for the first two weeks of school. We do have 136 students who have 95% or better attendance so far, and 67 of those have perfect attendance. We will begin our weekly SUKAPI student recognition beginning on Monday September 8, 2025, and recognize weekly perfect attendance. This year we tried something new and had 6<sup>th</sup> grade only on the first day of school. This gave them the opportunity to learn about the school, find all of their classes, meet their teachers, and learn how to open lockers without the upper classes in the building. This helped relieve some anxiety and start the year off on a positive note for them. We had 124 out of an expected 147 6<sup>th</sup> grade students attend.

We will begin home visits this week for students who have not yet enrolled/attended school for this year.

# **Behavior:**

We have had a couple behavior incidents to start off the year. Several of them were conflicts between students. We were able to intervene on have a successful conflict resolution process for two incidents, but we did have one fight that occurred prior to us finding out about the conflict. We did have one vape alarm, but could not determine which student had a vape.

#### **EVENTS:**

Open House: On our open house night we provided an opportunity for parents to come in and meet their student's teachers and counselors. We also provided a meal of hot dogs, chips and a drink. We had parents/guardians of 20 of our 6<sup>th</sup> grade students, 13 of our 7<sup>th</sup> grade students, and 6 of our 8<sup>th</sup> grade students attend.

## **COMMUNITY OUTREACH:**

One of focuses this year will be to continue and improve parent communication through positive contact and relationship building. All teachers will be sending out positive contacts weekly, administrators and counselors will be working on positive reinforcement, and teaching communication and interpersonal relationship skills to prevent and resolve conflict. We are still searching for a parent will be a part of the BMS School Leadership Team (SLT).
