3.3 <u>Ian Hansen – 2025 National Merit Scholarship Finalist</u>

Approximately 1.3 million 2024 high school juniors (i.e., this year's seniors) took the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT®) and met other program requirements to enter the 2025 competition for National Merit Scholarship Program recognition and scholarships. From that group, high scorers were identified and 16,000 qualified as Semifinalists – the highest-scoring entrants in each state. In February, the National Merit Scholarship Corp further narrowed the field and announced this year's Finalists. District 200 is proud to have a student among this prestigious group.
