WE Embrace Equity: Padres Unidos at Mountain View Middle School

When Matt Pedersen became principal at Mountain View Middle School, he noticed an opportunity for Spanish-speaking parents to be more engaged with the school.

He worked with the school’s Community Liaison Nora Acosta to meet with a handful of Spanish-speaking parents interested in a leadership role at the school. The goal was to have a conversation about their needs and concerns. They attended school events and recruited more Spanish-speaking parents.

That small group of parents, Padres Unidos, is now 66 members strong. They meet once a month to discuss school processes, communications and plan educational opportunities to help both students and parents at Mountain View.
