Type: Regular Business Action

Districts and open-enrollment charter schools are required to certify annually to the State Board of Education and the commissioner that, for each subject in the required curriculum other than physical education, students have access to instructional materials that cover all of the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills. Districts and charter schools will be unable to order 2026-27 instructional materials through EMAT (Educational Materials System) or receive disbursement funds until the certification has been received by the Texas Education Agency.
