Code Ann. § 6-20-1905, this letter is to provide notice that the Marvell-Elaine School District has been identified by the Arkansas Department of Education (Department) as a school district in Fiscal Distress. According to Ark. Code Ann. § 6-20-1904, Marvell-Elaine School District meets one (1) or more of the criteria necessary to be identified as a school district in Fiscal Distress, including:

- A declining balance determined to jeopardize the fiscal integrity of the school district.
- Any other fiscal condition of a school district deemed to have a detrimental negative impact on the continuation of educational services by that school district.

The Department will request that the State Board of Education (SBOE) classify the Marvell-Elaine School District as being in Fiscal Distress at its meeting on April 11, 2019. Ark. Code Ann. § 6-20-1907 state no school district identified in Fiscal Distress may incur any debt without prior written approval of the Department of Education. "Any debt" includes any employment contract, vendor contract, lease, loan, purchase or any other obligation that will increase the district's financial obligations, accounts payable or its liabilities. The district is required to obtain prior written approval from the Department, effective with its receipt of this letter. The department will schedule a training at your earliest convenience on the debt request process. Please retain this notice in your district's audit file.
