- 1. Welcome and Introductions Superintendent Peters welcomed everyone to the annual Community Recreation meeting. Introductions occurred.
- 2. Community Recreation Insurance Update Mr. Strefling was not able to attend the meeting but has renewed the recreation insurance for 2026. A copy of the policy is on file at the Office of the Superintendent.
- 3. Community Recreation Director Address Superintendent Peters provided an overview of the meeting's format and welcomed Erik Haskins who will most likely be taking over the Community Recreation Director duties in the future.

- Youth Soccer Spring 152 participants/12 teams Fall 193 participants (55 from New Buffalo)/16 teams – Will be looking for a treasurer in the future – No financial concerns. \$14,585

- Youth Baseball 121 participants Tee-Ball (6 teams), 8U (2 teams), 10U (2 teams), 12U (2 teams) and Pony (2 teams). Successful season. Participated in two (2) all-star tournaments. The BBA will be looking for a new president in the future. No financial concerns. \$21,103
- Youth Softball 93 participants 8U (2 teams), 10U (2 teams), 12U (2 teams) and 14U (2 teams). No concerns shared. No financial concerns. \$19,328.21
- Floor Hockey Welcome new president Danielle Mottl 175 hockey players from 1st through 8th grade – 18 registered in the new development program for 4 to 6 year olds – Going back to the Buchanan tournament this season – the adult league is still undecided at this time – adding an additional pre-season tournament in Lansing. No financial concerns. \$14,000
- Football We had 47 athletes signed up for Rocket Football this year, a slight decrease from the past couple years. We had 17 signed up for Flag Football (K-2nd Grade), divided into 2 teams. We had 17 signed up for Rocket Minors Flag Football (3rd/4th grade), divided into 2 teams. We had 13 signed up for Rocket Majors, all on 1 team. Flag football played teams from Buchanan, River Valley/New Buffalo, and Berrien Springs. Minors played teams from Berrien Springs, River Valley/New Buffalo, Bloomingdale and Bangor. Majors played in our 8-man league with Fennville, Saugatuck, Bloomingdale, Red Arrow Raiders, and Eau Claire. The Rocket Football account had \$4,574.61 as of the end of October.
- Community Playground Students and community members continue to enjoy the recently renovated playground.
- Aquatic Center Operations continue to run smoothly with strong community participation. Staffing recruitment remains an ongoing priority. Looking forward to the upcoming renovation project, which will bring significant improvements to the facility.
- 5. Aquatic Center Renovations Spring/Summer 2026 The Bridgman Aquatic Center will be closed from April through August 10, 2026 for a \$4.2 million renovation funded entirely by the community's recreation millage, with no tax increase or impact on school instructional funds. The project will modernize key systems, improve energy efficiency, and enhance the user experience for swimmers, students, teams, therapy programs, and families. Upgrades include a new HVAC system, a replacement roof, improved UV water treatment, structural maintenance and recaulking, updated fire alarms, and refreshed pool deck finishes.
