Public Conduct on District Property

No person on district property or grounds, including parking lots, will:

- 1. Injure or threaten to injure another;
- 2. Damage the property of another or of the district;
- 3. Initiate or circulate a report, one knows to be false, concerning an alleged hazardous substance, impending fire, explosion, catastrophe or other emergency that will take place in or upon a school;
- 4. Violate parking regulations;
- 5. Drive a vehicle in an unsafe manner;
- 6. Impede, delay or otherwise interfere with the orderly conduct of the district's educational program or any other activity taking place on district property which has been authorized by the Board, superintendent, principal or other authorized administrator;
- 7. Enter any portion of district premises at any time for purposes other than those which are lawful and authorized by district officials;
- 8. Bring, possess[, conceal] or use a weapon as prohibited by Board policy JFCJ Weapons in the Schools and state and federal law;
- 9. Possess, consume, sell, give or deliver unlawful drugs and/or alcoholic beverages. Possess, sell, give or deliver drug paraphernalia;
- 10. Use, distribute or sell tobacco products or inhalant delivery systems;
- 11. Wear, possess, use, distribute, display or sell any clothing, jewelry, emblem, badge, symbol, sign or other things which are evidence of membership or affiliation in any gang. Use speech or commit any act or omission in furtherance of the interests of any gang or gang activity. A "gang" is defined as a group that identifies itself through the use of a name, unique appearance or language including hand signs, claiming of geographical territory or the espousing of a distinctive belief system that frequently results in criminal activity;
- 12. Willfully violate Board policies, administrative regulations or school rules designed to maintain public order on district property.

Persons having no legitimate purpose or business on district property or violating or threatening to violate the above rules may be issued a trespass citation, ejected from the premises, and/or referred to law enforcement officials.

Public Conduct on District Property (Version 1)

No person on district property or grounds, including parking lots, will:

- 1. Injure or threaten to injure another;
- 2. Damage the property of another or of the district;
- 3. Initiate or circulate a report, one knows to be false, concerning an alleged hazardous substance, impending fire, explosion, catastrophe or other emergency that will take place in or upon a school;
- 4. Violate parking regulations;
- 5. Drive a vehicle in an unsafe manner;
- 6. Impede, delay or otherwise interfere with the orderly conduct of the district's educational program or any other activity taking place on district property which has been authorized by the Board, superintendent, principal or other authorized administrator;
- 7. Enter any portion of district premises at any time for purposes other than those which are lawful and authorized by district officials;
- 8. Bring, possess[, conceal] or use a weapon as prohibited by Board policy JFCJ Weapons in the Schools and state and federal law;

- 4. Drive a vehicle in an unsafe manner;
- 5. Impede, delay, or otherwise interfere with the orderly conduct of the district's educational program or any other activity taking place on school property which has been authorized by the Board, principal, or other authorized administrator;
- 6. Enter any portion of the school premises at any time for purposes other than those which are lawful and authorized by district officials;
- 7. Possess an unauthorized loaded or unloaded firearm or any other instrument used as a dangerous or deadly weapon as defined in Board policy JFCJ Weapons in Schools;
- 8. Consume, sell, give, or deliver tobacco, unlawful drugs including drug paraphernalia, or alcoholic beverages as defined in Board policy JFCH Alcohol;
- 9. Wear, posses, use, distribute, display, or sell any clothing, jewelry, emblem, badge, symbol, sign, or other things which are evidence of membership or affiliation in any gang. Use speech or commit an act or omission in furtherance of the interest of any gang or gang activity. A "gang" is defined as a group that identifies itself through the use of a name, unique appearance or language including hand signs, claming of geographical territory, or the espousing of a distinctive belief system that frequently results in criminal activity as defined in Board policy JFCEA Secret Societies–Gang Activity;
- 10. Willfully violate other rules and regulations adopted by the Board designed to maintain public order on district property.

Persons having no legitimate purpose or business on district property or violating or threatening to violate the above rules may be issued a trespass warrant, ejected from the premises and/or referred to law enforcement officials.
