PROGRAM UPDATES

Construction Trades: House Update

• The roof is on the house! Students were able to lay the roof deck and then put down the ice shield and tar paper, then started the shingles. They have been on a time crunch because Camden seniors are done on Tuesday, the 15th.

Cyber Security/Digital Forensics Update

• Students are getting their certifications completed for A+ and Net+. Many of the students have also obtained Microsoft certifications. 90% of class have completed Cybersecurity Essentials.

Engineering, Drafting & Design Technologies Program

• Students are now working with JESCO in Litchfield doing AutoCad and Solidworks designs and re-designs (conversions).

Criminal Justice Program Update

• Each and every senior student passed their NOCTI exam in Criminal Justice! This is no small feat and we are very proud of our students!

Health Science Program Update

- All but a handfull of students have completed their 24.5 hours at the hospital. The next step is actually taking the CNA certification test.
- Seniors are completing their Health Science exam for the state. There are 14 yet to test and all are finding it very difficult. A 70% is needed to "pass" the exam.

Welding, Brazing & Soldering Program Update

• The two seniors who accepted the work-based learning opportunity at Tenneco are doing well. We have 4 more students testing on Monday at Nex-Solutions and at JESCO to obtain full-time work. Ellwood Staffing has been wonderful at helping our students to get these opportunities!
