The waiver request must be submitted to TEA (Commissioner) no later than October 1, 2009 or 30th day after the first school day the district exceeds the limit, along with this form include a copy of a current compliance plan that has been approved by the local board of trustees. The plan must include the name(s) of campus(es), campus rating, grade(s), and number of sections exceeding a 22:1 class size ratio; steps to be taken to bring the district into compliance; timeline for completion; any new efforts/progress toward compliance (if plan was previously submitted); and specific reasons that noncompliance must be addressed. In addition, districts that request a waiver due to an inability to employ teachers must document efforts to recruit and hire staff.

PLAN OF ACTION

Blanton exceeds the cap by two students in fourth grade. The District is working with a demographer and redrawing boundary lines for elementary campuses. This new boundary configuration will be introduced to the community this year with plans for implementation in the fall of 2010.

Cavazos exceeds the cap by two students in first grade. The first grade classes at Cavazos have been closed to all new enrollees. With the classes closed, attrition should balance the classes to no more than 22 per class.

Dowling exceeds the cap by one student in kindergarten. Normal attrition should balance the classes by the end of the semester.

Murry Fly exceeds the cap by one student in first grade. The first grade classes at Murry Fly have been closed to all new enrollees. With the classes closed, attrition should balance the classes to no more than 22 per class.

Ireland exceeds the cap by one student in kindergarten and one student in fourth grade. The magnet configuration of the campus will allow the campus some control in the enrollment of students. Normal attrition should balance the classes by the end of the semester.

Milam exceeds the cap by one student in fourth grade bilingual. The magnet configuration of the campus will allow the campus some control in the enrollment of students. Normal attrition should balance the classes by the end of the semester.

Zavala exceeds the cap by two students in kindergarten and two students in fourth grade bilingual. The magnet configuration of the campus will allow the campus some control in the enrollment of students. This, coupled with attrition, should balance the classes by the end of the semester.
