## Next Generation Accountability Index

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#### What is this index?

**Connecticut's Next Generation** Accountability System is a broad set of 12 indicators that help tell the story of how well a school is preparing its students for success in college, careers and life. The system moves beyond test scores and graduation rates and instead provides a more holistic, multifactor perspective of district and school performance and incorporates student growth over time.

#### Key Elements of the Index

- Provides a more complete picture of a school or district
- Prevents narrowing of the curriculum
- Expands ownership and accountability to all staff
- Encourages us to consider growth and not overall performance alone

#### How Categories are assigned...

Schools *initially* placed in Categories 1 and 2 will drop one category (to Categories 2 and 3, respectively) if one or more of the following are present:

- an outlier achievement gap in ELA, Math, or Science;
- an outlier graduation gap based on the six-year adjusted cohort graduation rate; or
- an assessment participation rate below 95% in any subject for all students or students with high needs.



#### HIGHEST PERFORMING

Elementary/middle and high schools are evaluated separately for the Highest Performing distinction. For each school type, the full list of Category 1-5 schools is sorted based on the Accountability Index from highest to lowest. The top 10% become *eligible* for distinction status. To be named a School of Distinction in the Highest Performing category, an eligible school:

- must have data reported for Indicator 1 (Academic Achievement).
- must be in Categories 1, 2, or 3;
- must NOT have an outlier achievement gap based on the difference in index scores between the High Needs subgroup and the non-High Needs group in ELA or Math;
- must NOT have an outlier graduation rate gap based on the six-year graduation rate difference between the High Needs subgroup and the Non-High Needs group; and
- must NOT have an assessment participation rate below 95% for the All Students group or the High Needs subgroup in ELA, Math, or Science.
