THREE RIVERS SCHOOL DISTRICT INCLEMENT WEATHER PROCEDURES

If inclement weather exists, or is forecast to exist in our school district the feasibility of providing home-to-school transportation will be discussed between the First Student busing Manager and the Director of Transportation no later than 5:30 AM.

The Director of Transportation will recommend a course of action (delay the start of school(s), close school(s), or keep school(s) open) to the Superintendent.

Utilizing the new *Synrevoice* automated calling system, all staff, parents, substitute teachers and media will be notified of the decision. The calling system sends messages both by e-mails and telephone calls (*these calls could begin as early as 5:30 AM*).

Important note about the calling system: It is voice activated, so the system must hear a voice when calling. This can be a live person answering the phone, your voice mail, or an answering machine. But it will not activate simply upon lifting the receiver on the phone and just listening without saying anything.

This is an automated system; an attempt to call back the identified number will not be successful. Please take the time to listen to any message left in its entirety.

All closures and/or delays will also be posted on our District website.

If a two-hour delay is announced in a particular school or area, then school will start two hours later than the regularly scheduled time. All bus pick-up times will be two hours later than normal. School will conclude at its regular time.

You are also advised to tune in to radio stations KAJO, KLDR, KRWQ and KBOY and TV stations KOBI (5), KDRV (12) and KTVL (10) for updates and in the event you don't have phone or internet service.

Athletic activities, school events and other scheduled field trips could be canceled if inclement weather is a concern.

Sometimes weather conditions leave some roads blocked or unsafe to travel, but school is still being held. Under these circumstances "straight line routes" will be run. Please refer to the "Straight Line Bus Route' attachment for your attendance area for this information.

If you live on one of the roads the buses cannot travel, you may bring your student to the nearest intersection of the main road traveled. This will also be the stop for the afternoon drop off.

It is very important that you keep the school informed of your current phone number and e-mail address to assure proper notification.

2010-2011 ADVERSE WEATHER CONDITIONS

In the event of adverse weather conditions parents are advised to tune in to Radio Stations KRWQ, KAJO, KLDR, KBOY and TV Stations KOBI (5), KDRV (12), KTVL (10) or the 3 Rivers School District Web Page for information on school bus schedules.

Sometimes weather conditions leave some roads blocked or unsafe to travel but school is still being held. Under these circumstances "straight line routes" will be run. This is the information you will get on the web page or radio/TV stations.

When straight line routes are run the roads affected are listed below.

If you live on one of the roads the buses cannot travel, you may bring your student to the nearest intersection of the main road traveled. This will also be the stop for the afternoon drop off.

Dear Three Rivers School District Parent/Guardian:

The No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (NCLB) requires all states to create their own high academic standards or what a child should know and be able to do for all grades in reading/language arts and mathematics. Each school and district must improve each year until all students meet these standards. This yearly improvement in school performance is called Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP).

The Oregon Department of Education established a minimum percentage of students who must meet or exceed academic proficiency standards on required statewide tests. Each year the target is raised. This year 70% of all students are expected to meet or exceed state targeted goals on reading/language arts and math. The goal is that all (100%) students will meet or exceed these academic proficiency requirements by the 2013-2014 school year. While NCLB is in the process of being revised, the current law is still in effect until Congress completes it reauthorization process

NCLB also requires that the Oregon Department of Education annually review the performance of each district that receives funds under Title I of the NCLB Act. If a district's academic performance is lower than the state's required level, the district will be identified as not making AYP

We are very proud of the accomplishments of all our schools based on the Oregon School Report Card that is issued each September for the school year. Hidden Valley High School, North Valley High School, Fleming Middle School, Manzanita School, Applegate School and Williams School have all been ranked by the Oregon School Report Card as Outstanding and all other TRSD's schools were ranked Satisfactory. In addition to this tremendous accomplishment we are please to report that 11 of our 14 schools met the federal guidelines for AYP.

Despite this commendation, the Three Rivers School District has been identified as not making AYP and is classified as being in Title 1 District Improvement –Year 1. The reason for this is that for 2 years in a row the district's total percentage of students with disabilities in elementary, middle, and high school did not meet the AYP goal. Due to the rising AYP goals, the district has anticipated this development and has already revised its Continuous Improvement Plan and identified strategies to meet the identified need and the ever growing difficulty of the challenge of having 100% of students meet or exceed state benchmarks.

A district with this classification has the responsibility to:

- consult with parents and school staff when developing the District Improvement Plan to identify and address the specific reasons for low student achievement. This plan explains how the district will use Title I and other funds to improve Title I schools;
- reserve at least ten percent of their annual Title I allocation to provide professional development for teachers and administrators.

Here are some suggestions to help you work with your school and district to support improvements:

- Learn more about the new NCLB requirements. Become aware of strategies to improve student academic achievement. Additional
 information and resources are available from the Oregon Department of Education (http://www.ode.state.or.us/search/page?id=576)
 and the US Department of Education (www.ed.gov) websites.
- 2. Talk with district staff about our District Improvement Plan to help students meet state standards in reading and mathematics.
- 3. Support and reinforce your child's good study habits and review their homework and test results.
- 4. Visit your child's school and volunteer.

District staff members are working diligently to ensure that every child meets high academic standards in a safe and caring learning environment.

The district is very proud of the success all its schools had during 2009-2010 based on the Oregon School Report Card ratings. We feel that our schools do an excellent job meeting the needs of all students daily but support the importance of striving to improve student success for each and every child.

We encourage you to contact the district office for further information on any of these requirements and to find out how you can become involved in the district's improvement efforts.
