Principal's Corner



The sun is shining and there are many things to smile about here at Hidden Valley High School this spring. As seniors are making preparations to finish strong our staff and school in general is busy on task with all of the activities that draw a close to yet another school year.

The past several months, administration has been busy with an internal review process in preparation for an external accreditation team from AdvancED to look at all things that pertain to our school. This process was held on April 7th and I would like to share the findings with you. Prior to me doing this, I feel it is necessary to share some background information. AdvancED is an organization that is world-wide and helps manage accreditation on a very large scale across the State of Oregon. We had to prepare a 65 page document that depicts how we meet all of the state standards in order to meet accreditation. This document was used as a school improvement tool to reflect upon while providing information to the external review team. The on-site team was composed of school administrators that had over 100 years experience from a variety of schools and settings around the state. This process included survey data from students, staff, and parents. It also included interviews of staff, students, and parents- coupled with documented feedback in three essential areas for our school to build our annual school improvement plan from. The first essential component that we received information about is that of needs improvement, the second is opportunity for growth, and the third is the powerful practices that are happening in our school, or the strengths. All three areas give focus areas for planning purposes. In no way are the findings all encompassing, but rather a snapshot into who and what we are. The findings were telling as we have been accredited with the team finding no large holes with the standards as a school.

Improvement...

AdvancED believes that we need to have a larger focus on data decision making in the classroom by using our PLC teams as the vehicle in which to do this...

Opportunity for Growth...

AdvanED believes we have an opportunity to work more technology into our basic structure both in and out of the classroom. Communication plans using technology are specifically noted.

Powerful Practice...

AdvanED believes our students are connected to each other, to our staff, and to our community. The amount of community investment and energy within most programs is staggering and immensely beneficial to our students and school...

I can tell you that I am proud to be associated with our school and community... this being said, the areas noted above are things we will build from. Our school is an amazing dynamic place that has countless moving parts. The most important is that of our students... and the partnerships we have with staff and parents. The accreditation process is large to say the least, but I do believe valuable as it confirmed some things and gave us a second to pause to reflect on some things as well. This process has given us a chance to smile and enjoy the sun and I hope you are doing the same... till next time,







HV softball team picks up first win


