In math we finished a unit on measurement and are now starting geometry. In April our class started weekly spelling words. We are trying to be prepared for first grade. Students have also been memorizing a couple of poems to present at our year-end program. Perhaps we will see you there?



Mrs. Agnifili's Class

Students in Mrs. Agnifili's class did not let the cold gloomy weather get them down. Instead they went surfing in Hawaii! O.K. although it was only through a "Magic Tree House" book, everyone jumped on their imaginary surfboards and rode the perfect wave. Students learned about waves, tides, gravity, and how the earth and moon function within the solar system.

Students continue to enjoy the art lessons taught by local artist Sherry Peterson. Their compositions are now on display in the Williams Public Library. Conny Lindly, another local artist visited our class to teach music.

Students are using the active board to copy geometrically shaped designs, find missing numbers, and create number sentences and equations. They are learning to find digits that equal ten, find doubles, and group them together to make a sum of 30, 40, and even 50! Our favorite thing in April was the science experiments and bottle rockets presented by John Salinas and his RCC students.

Mr. Morgan's Class

Mr. Morgan's class spent April keeping busy inside and outside of the classroom. Students have been busy with reading, math, science, and OAKS testing. On April 16th students spent the day with Rogue Community College teacher John Salinas and his students. They explored science under the microscope, the human anatomy, a fire breathing sound pipe, electrifying magic, and best of all launching home made soda bottle rockets on the soccer field. We also wrote thank you letters to Mr. Salinas and his students for the fun science day!

The last full month of the school year in Mr. Morgan's class will be very scientific. On the week of May 4-8th we will have visitors from Ashland ScienceWorks Museum teaching us how to make an inquiry about Ramps and Rollers. On May 13th we will visit White Oak Farm to learn more about habitats. On May 21st we will explore Riparian Habitats of the Rogue Basin up close and personal on the Rogue River Jet boat Excursions.

Students in Mrs. Bingham's class had a wonderful month of April. John Salinas and his students from Rogue Community College entertained us with a great day of science. All student got to build and launch bottle rockets. It was perfect weather for a launch.
