On October 22 we held our first **Early Learning Readiness Educational Summit**, with 27 local child care providers attending. Participants listened to information about early childhood screening, behavior referral processes, kindergarten readiness, a make and take activity designed to develop young learners social and emotional skills using picture schedules.



At the annual **UnScary Halloween**, an event targeting young families, we had 315 people in attendance. Partnering with National Honor Society students and our Parent Advisory Committee, games were played, families enjoyed a healthy snack and every child received a book to read at home.

Twenty-four children and their families attended this event with volunteer assistance from the Youth Advisory Council. Families were able to attend for FREE with a Community Food Shelf Donation. Over 60 pounds of food was donated.
