C. Goal or Need Addressed: This resolution supports the district's goal of compliance with TEA safety standards including new requirements under HB 33 that took effect September 1, 2025.

 Background information: House Bill 33 is a new law in Texas that took effect on September 1, 2025. It was passed in response to documented school safety failures and sets stricter standards for how schools and law enforcement respond to active shooter threats. The bill requires that district Emergency Operations Plan reflect current response standards, including ALERRT-based active shooter response strategies and having active response equipment available to ALERRT trained law enforcement officers during such emergency situations.
