## Communications: Synrevoice—Automated Voice Messaging & Attendance notifications

We will use **Synervoice** to send out important messages about school closures and school events. When you get a call from the school using **Synervoice**, it is important that you say **"Hello"** as this trig-



gers the message. If you have voicemail, it will leave a message. If you have email registered with the school, we will often send emails as well.

At this time, our Attendance Clerk, Mary Paul, personally follows up on absences on a daily basis, If your student missed all or part of school, please call the school the next morning to clear your student's absences. The number is 541-592-2116; ask for the attendance office. You may also send Ms. Paul an email to verify or excuse an absence or tardy: mary.paul@threerivers.k12.or.us. It is very important for you and your student to have these absences cleared. Students end up doing lunch detentions for un-cleared absences.

The afterschool bus will transport students, per the "Straight-Line" bus route, Monday through Thursday.

  Students may not leave the campus and return later. Students are given a 15 minute break and snack about 4:30. There is no cost for this snack.

  No student will be allowed to ride the activity bus if they are not in an after school program or a sport. We will tell the bus drivers to transport the student home, but a referral will be written, followed by consequences.

  Students are required to sign in and out. If you are assuming your child is coming to after-school, you may call the school the following day to check on attendance.

All the money raised will go to the Davis Family.

During this game, staff from both sides will pull out all the stops and antics to support Brooke and bring the ultimate staff trophy home to their school. Be prepared for tutu's, crazy hair, smack talk and lots of school spirit!

The entire communities of the Illinois Valley and Murphy, along with all of Josephine County are encourage to come support this great family. Additional donations will be accepted for the Davis family. It is a great way to celebrate the Luck o' the Irish (or the Cougars) and watch some basketball.

Illinois Valley residents Jason and Roxy Davis' daughter, Brooke, was born with Hydrocephalus, a disease she will fight her entire life. Despite the future struggles, Jason, Roxy and big brother Bentley celebrated Brooke's birth last October. Since then Brooke has had three surgeries and a number of check-ups and visits to Doernbecher Children's Hospital in Portland, OR. Each trip brings with it travel costs, medical bills and lost work time. All of this adds up quickly and IVHS students want to help.

Hydrocephalus is a rare disease, an imbalance of Cerebrospinal Fluid (CSF fluid) which surrounds the brain and spinal cord and creates immense amounts of pressure. Thus far

Brooke has had surgeries to relieve the pressure around her brain and she continues to be monitored closely. The effects of the pressure and extra fluid on Brooke's brain will not be known until she is older.

The 32nd Annual Academic Masters challenge will be held at Illinois Valley High School on Wednesday, April 29th, at 6:30 PM. The Academic Masters Foundation has \$15,000 to give away to the students from the four area schools—Grants Pass HS, Hidden Valley HS, Illinois Valley HS, and North Valley HS.

Every spring, students compete in this challenge, first at their high school level. Students participating in the event will take a test in one of five categories: English, Math, Music, Science, & Social Studies. Students are allowed to take up to all five tests, if they wish. At each school, the four top-scoring students in each test category will compete and present at a school assembly for a chance to represent their school as a semifinalist.

Once the semifinalists from each school are chosen, they compete in front of a live audience (each school takes a turn hosting the event, and this year is IVHS' turn). There are 20 total semifinalists (one student from each of the four schools, for each of the five categories).

The place finalists in each category receive the following cash amounts:

4th Place \$300 cash 3rd Place \$500 cash

2nd Place \$800 cash 1st Place \$1200 cash

#### For Juniors

- ▼ Take the SAT: It is suggested that Juniors take the SAT or ACT's in the spring of their junior year. The SAT exam will be given at IVHS in May. See Ms. Thornhill in the Counseling Center to see if you qualify for a fee waiver. Register for the SAT at <a href="https://www.collegeboard.org">www.collegeboard.org</a>. Our school code is 380150. Students may also choose to take the ACT. Sign up for the ACT at <a href="https://www.act.org">www.act.org</a>
- ✓ <u>Junior Girls</u>: If you are interested in attending Girl's State, a leadership event for 5 days sponsored by the American Legion, please see Ms. Tucker in counseling.

#### Seniors Planning to Enroll in College in the Fall of 2015

- ✓ <u>Take the SAT or ACT</u> if you are planning to go to a university. Go to <u>www.collegeboard.org</u> to register for the SAT, or <u>www.act.org</u> to register for the ACT.
- ✓ <u>Apply to Schools</u>: Don't forget to get your applications for admissions and scholarships in by school deadlines. If you qualify for free or reduced lunch, you may be eligible for a deferral of application fees to Oregon University System schools. Many state universities had early admissions in November, so check the admissions deadlines for the colleges you want to attend.
- File your FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid): Each student and one parent must complete this application for a student to be eligible for federal and state college grants (free money!!). First apply for a PIN at <a href="www.pin.ed.gov">www.pin.ed.gov</a>. Both the student and one parent/guardian must have a PIN (your electronic signature) to apply for the FAFSA. As soon after January 1<sup>st</sup> as possible, complete the FAFSA at <a href="www.fafsa.ed.gov">www.fafsa.ed.gov</a>.
- ✓ <u>IV Scholarship Packet:</u> Go through the IVHS Scholarship Packet and decide which scholarships you want to apply for. You will need two letters of recommendation (at least one from non-school, non-family). Ask your employers, community members, or friends of the family. You will also need to turn in two staff recommendations and typed responses to four short essay questions. The scholarship application is available online at <a href="http://www.jocoeducationalfund.org">http://www.jocoeducationalfund.org</a> The deadline to get all of the materials in is: 2/20/2015.
- ✓ <u>Apply for the Oregon Student Assistance Commission (OSAC) Scholarships</u>: This online scholarship application contains the Ford and Gear Up scholarships and many others. Complete the application at <u>www.oregonstudentaid.gov</u>, available in Nov. Early Bird due date 2/16/13. Final due date 3/1/15
- ✓ <u>Apply for RCC Foundation Scholarships</u>: If you may be attending RCC you should submit their scholarships application. Three out of four students who submit an application receive a scholarship. Apply online at <a href="https://www.rccfoundation.org">www.rccfoundation.org</a>.
- ✓ Check for additional scholarships available posted in Counseling.

#### YEAR-ROUND IN-SCHOOL & ON-LINE STUDY RESOURCES AVAILABLE

On-Line support to help your student keep the skills learned, in shape. Like exercising your muscles on a daily or weekly basis, so too does the brain need its physical activity. The following web sites are provided to assist with the "Summer Brain Exercise" routine.

#### My student doesn't understand their homework . . . now what?

We have all been in the situation where our students don't understand the homework and we are trying to dust off the files in our head to remember how to do that math problem or remember what happened in this historic battle. It can be frustrating for both the student and the parent to get through the homework. In today's world full of technology students have numerous resources available to help them re-learn the concepts. The following are just three of the many sites available.

Khan Academy – www.khanacademy.org This website has over 4,000 videos on subjects from geometry to chemistry to computer science. This is a great tool that actually reteaches the material step by step. Many times hearing the concept explained by someone else makes that light bulb turn on and the student understands. Interactive practice is also available to solidify the concepts.

<u>Sophia</u> – www.sophia.org Video clips are also available at Sophia, but there is also much more. Over 28,000 tutorials including slideshows and screencasts are available anytime. The site also tailors the information according to the student's learning style, which is determined through a short quiz.

Quizlet – www.quizlet.com This is a great study tool. There are thousands of flash cards & quizzes on the site developed by students and teachers from around the world in nearly every subject you can think of. Students can use an already created tool or create one of their own to challenge themselves and others in their class. This is a great vocabulary tool.

**ODYSSEYWARE** is an on-line academic website which provides innovative, 21st century learning opportunities for our students.

Three Rivers School District/Illinois Valley High School uses this program for students outside of the regular classroom setting, and for students that need to do make up classes (Credit Retrieval) to be eligible for graduation.

ODYSSEYWARE (OW) is web-based, If you have internet access, your student can access his/her assignments, which allows them the ability to complete the courses as fast as he/she needs to, whether they are in the classroom or at home.
