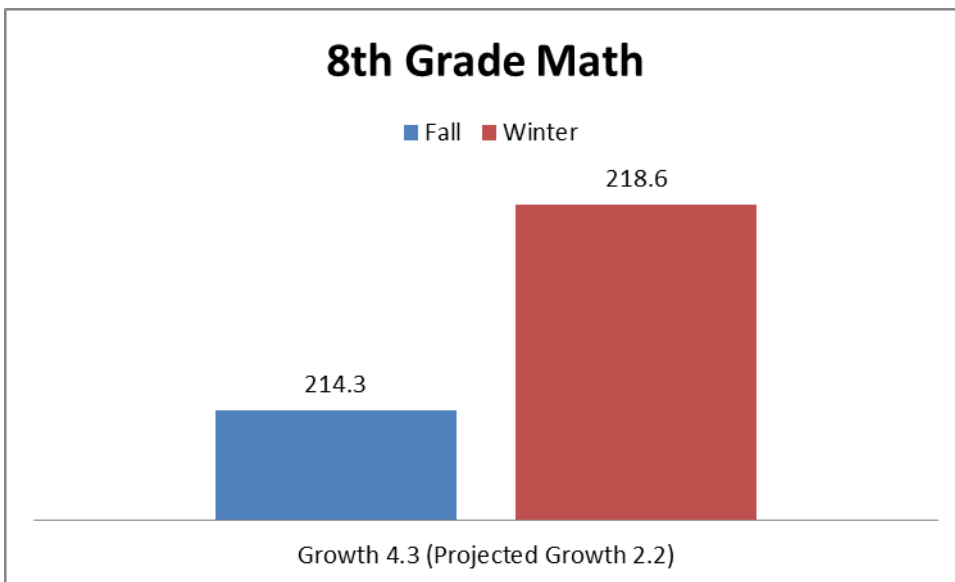
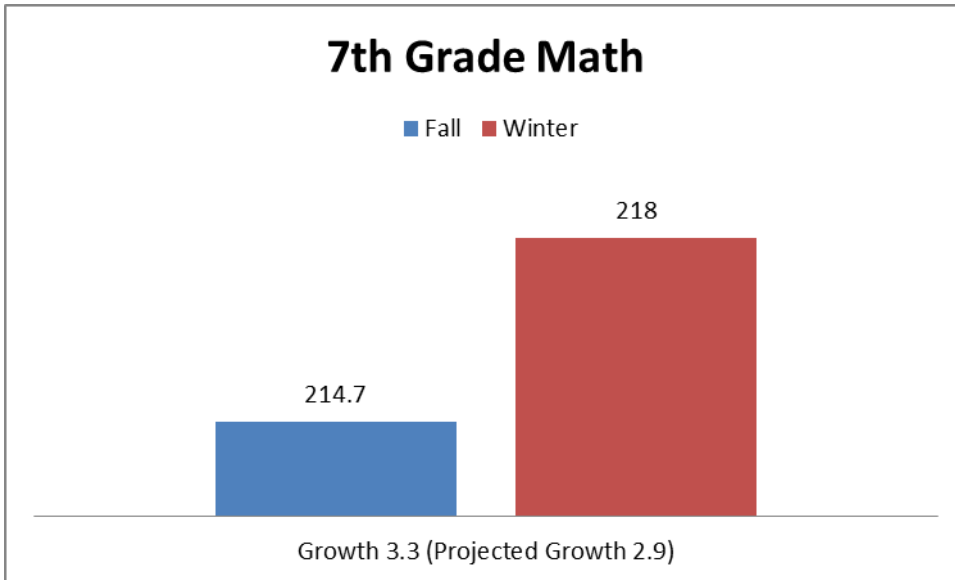
Parent Teacher Conferences

Winter MAP Data

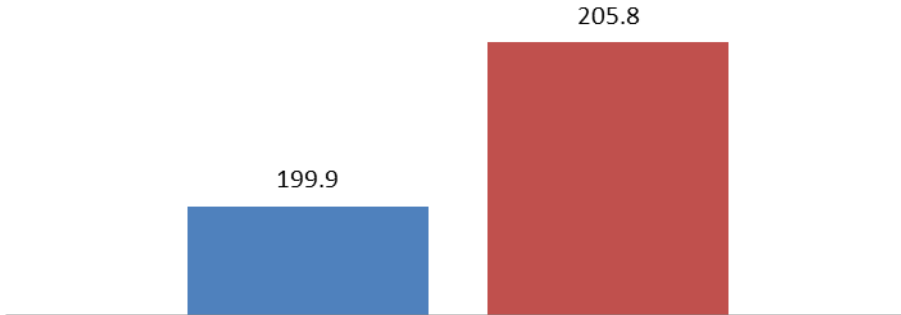

5th Grade Reading

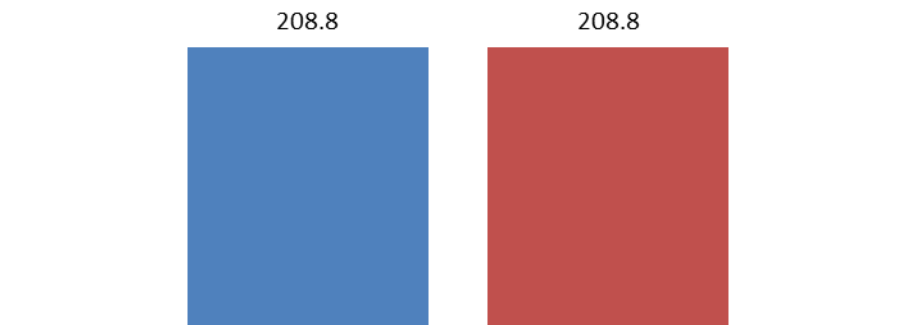

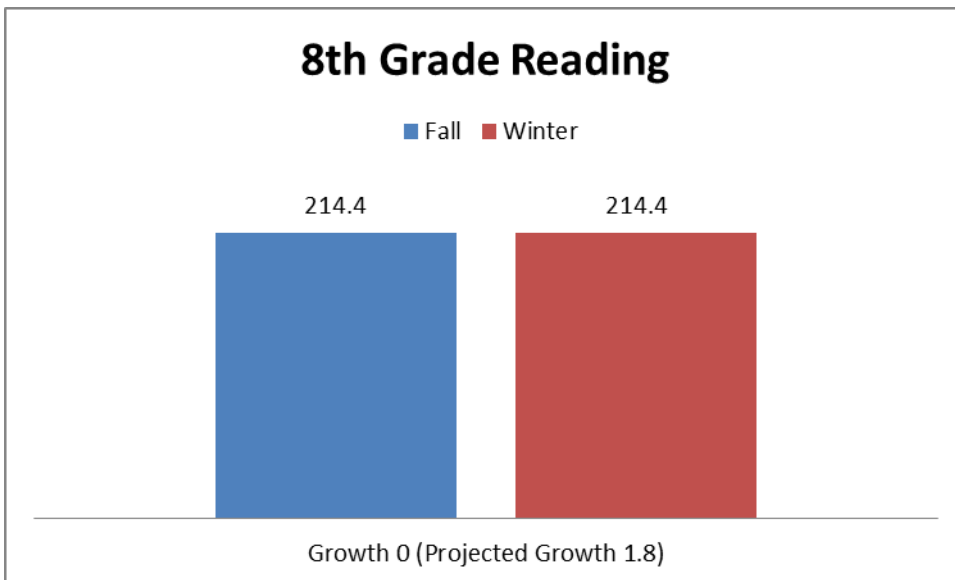
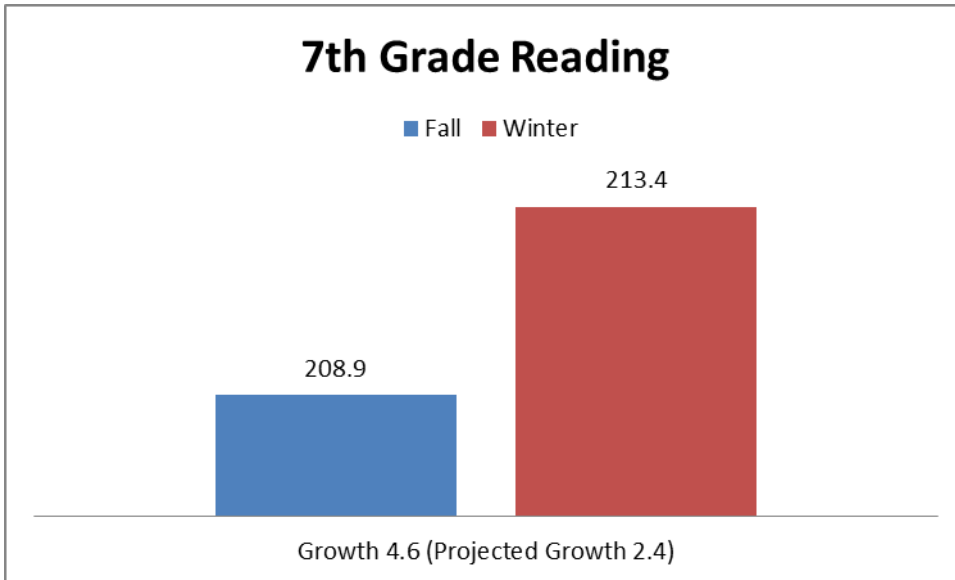
Growth 5.8 (Projected Growth 4.0)

■ Fall ■ Winter



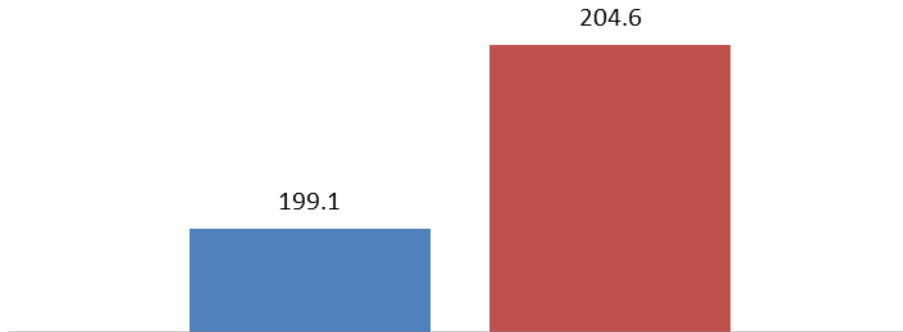
Growth 0 (Projected Growth 3.1)



Reading Highlights – Both 5th and 7th grade grew well beyond their projected growth which is a great sign of student improvement. We are looking more closely at individual students who may have grown less to see what we can do to boost their growth by the end of the year. Both 6th and 8th grade did not meet their projected growth so we are looking at incorporating new reading strategies into everyday instruction and 6th grade will be focusing on remediation skills during their 7th period study skills classes.

5th Grade Language Usage

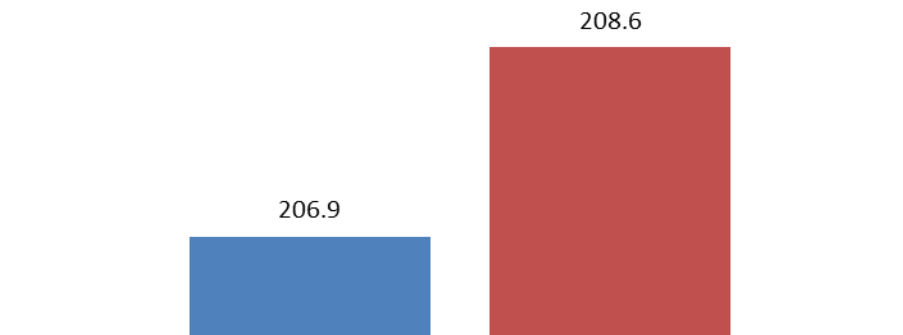

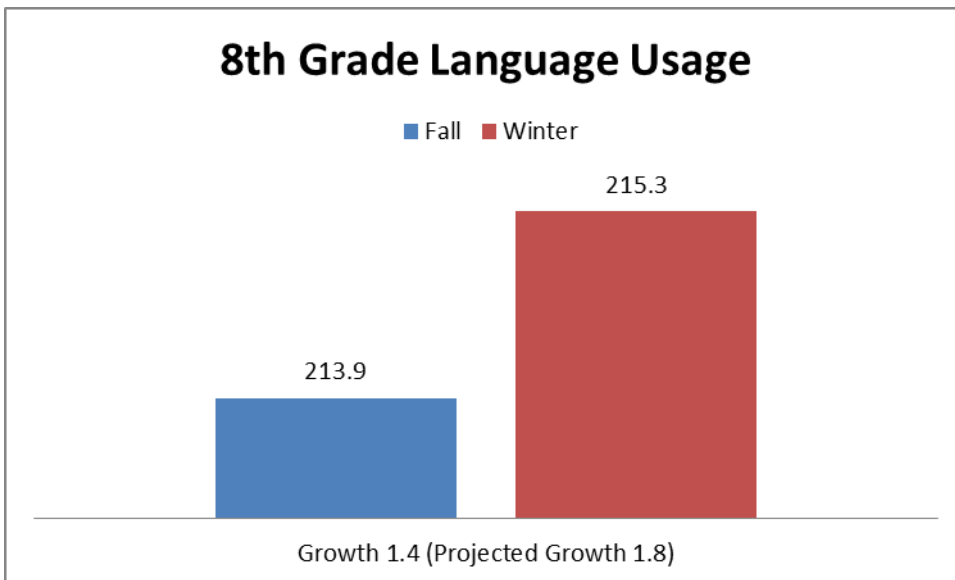
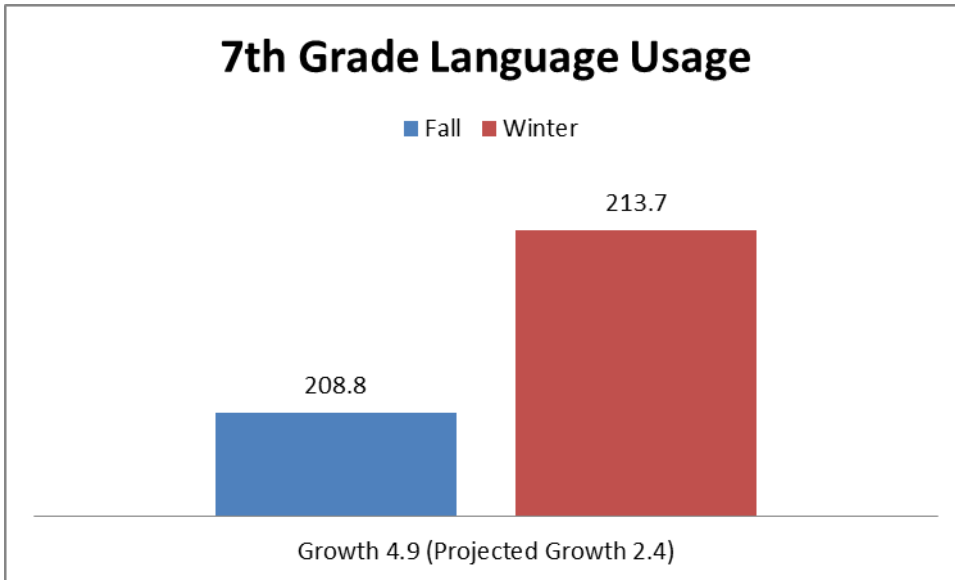
Growth 5.6 (Projected Growth 4.0)
