
Superintendent's Report November 24, 2020

Additional Governor's Cares Act

I requested this additional funding and was able to submit and accept it. We have to spend it by December 31, 2020.

Elementary District will receive and additional \$600,000 for technology and additional \$113,758 for other COVID related expenses, High School District will receive \$400,000 for technology and \$46,949 for additional COVID related expenses.
