



Central High School TX-936 AFJROTC from San Angelo Independent School District along with Wylie High School TX-200010 AFJROTC from Wylie Independent School District will host Cadet Leadership Course (CLC) this year at Howard Payne University in Brownwood, TX. The course will run June 4th-9th, 2017.

CLC is designed to prepare upcoming second year cadets to fill key positions in "their" JROTC programs. The focus is on "Corps Ownership" by the cadets with strong emphasis on AFJROTC Mission: "Develop Citizens of Character dedicated to serving their nation and community" and the Air Force's core values of "Integrity First, Service before Self and Excellence in All We Do."

CLC is instructor led and managed. CLC is a very intense week of activities for the cadets, packed with plenty of opportunities to experience leadership, followership, citizenship and teambuilding. CLC is not an introduction to JROTC. Cadets will participate in academics, drill and ceremonies, team building and light physical training. The course will hone and build on leadership, team building, management and citizenship skills introduced and taught in JROTC programs and based on JROTC curriculum and mission. Altogether, CLC is an outstanding venue to train our JROTC leadership and our future leaders of this great country.

The goals of CLC are to provide cadets a safe, positive and interactive learning experience focused on Corps ownership, leadership, teamwork, citizenship, discipline, personal development, and personal and team accomplishment. CLC will enable cadets to: improve confidence, self-esteem, self-reliance, personal appearance and leadership; build on the values of integrity, service and excellence; expand their skills of critical thinking and problem solving, communication and collaboration; demonstrate military customs, courtesies and traditions; and develop habits of good order, discipline and social skills.

CADET LEADERSHIP COURSE OVERVIEW. CLC is an optional Co-Curricular program that teaches AFJROTC cadets aspects of citizenship and leadership in a highly structured and focused instructional environment. Its mission is to promote this development by preparing cadets for leadership roles in their units, schools, and local communities. As such, the activities during CLC should stress the following: team building, leadership, and respect for authority, responsible citizenship, personal character, academic achievement, health, and community service.

Additional info:

San Angelo Central High School AFJROTC hosts a five-day “basic” cadet leadership course (CLC), working with cadets having completed their first or second year of high school JROTC. Cadets are led through a variety of classroom instructional courses on leadership (taught by high school AFJROTC instructors); they are also coached on marching, problem-solving/team building, and sports activities while being guided by college-level ROTC cadets.

Abilene Cooper High School AFJROTC hosts a parallel cadet staff and leadership course (CSLC), at the same location and timeframe. This camp is more focused on cadets assuming primary leadership roles (commanders, deputy commanders, etc) for their senior year in their respective JROTC programs. These cadets receive more challenging, higher-level classroom instruction while still getting refresher training in marching, problem-solving, and sports activities.

Together, these camps prepare our cadets for future success in JROTC...and beyond high school.

Note: both camps are held simultaneously on the Howard Payne University campus at Brownwood, Texas.
