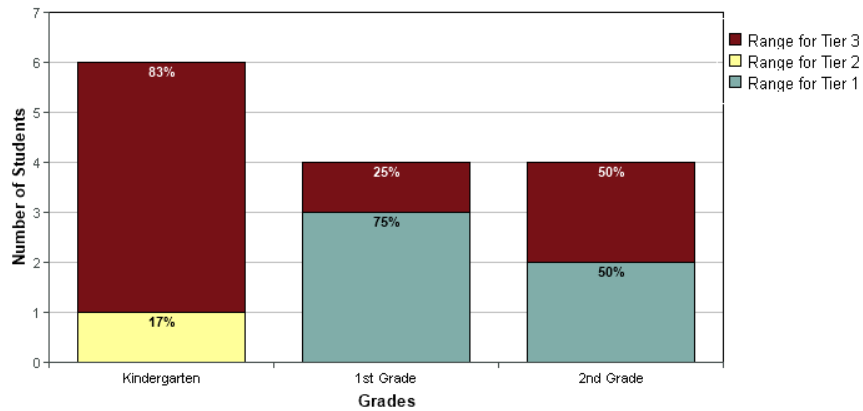

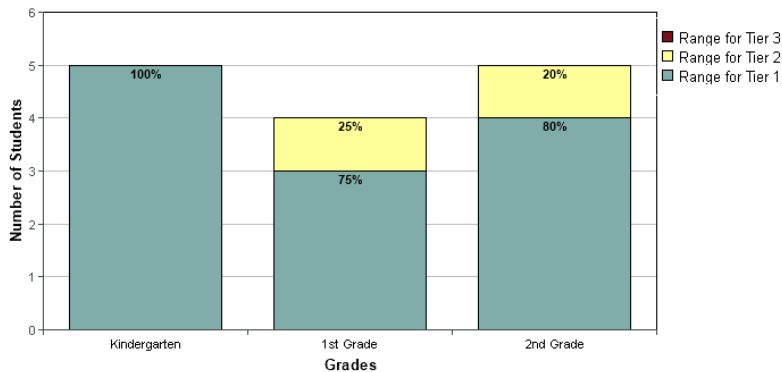

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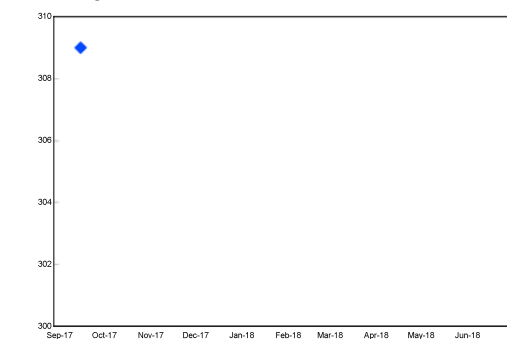
All Grades - May 2018



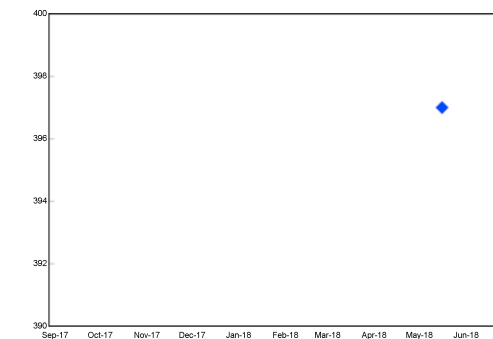

Star Math K-2 grade

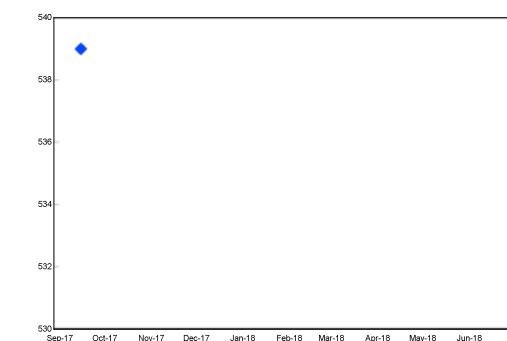

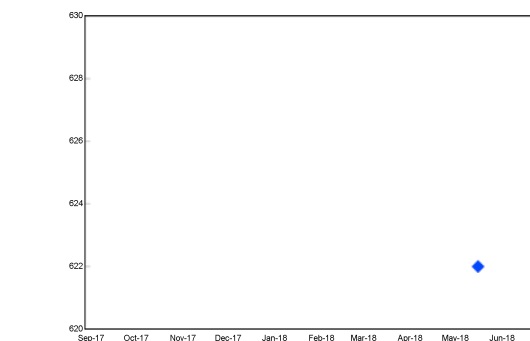
