### Pana Jr. High School Family Engagement Policy

#### PART I. GENERAL EXPECTATIONS

The **Pana Jr. High School** agrees to implement the following statutory requirements:

- Consistent with section 1118, the school will work to ensure that the required school level family engagement policy meet the requirements of section 1118 of the ESEA, and each include, as a component, a school-parent compact consistent with section 1118(d) of the ESEA. (See attached compacts).

- 1. The **Pana Jr. High School** will take the following actions to involve parents/guardians in the joint development of its school family engagement plan under section 1118 of the ESEA:

- 2. The **Pana Jr. High School** will take the following actions to involve parents/guardians in the process of school review and improvement under section 1116 of the ESEA:

3. The <u>Pana Jr. High School</u> will hold an annual meeting to inform parents/guardians of the school's participation in Title I, Part A programs, and to explain the Title I, Part A requirements and the right of parents to be involved in Title I, Part A programs. The school will convene the meeting at a time convenient for parents and will offer a flexible number of additional family engagement meetings, such as in the morning or evening, so that as many parents/guardians as possible are able to attend.

The school will invite all parents/guardians of children participating in Title I, Part A programs to this meeting, and will encourage them to attend, by:

- "Hosting a meeting in the beginning of the year and inviting parents/guardians to that meeting to hear about the Title One School Wide Program and discuss ways that parents can become involved in the program. Parents are also welcome to come any time during conferences to discuss the program if the meeting time is not convenient.
- 4. The <u>Pana Jr. High School</u> will provide parents/guardians of participating children information in a timely manner about Title I, Part A programs that includes a description and explanation of the school's curriculum, the forms of academic assessment used to measure children's progress, and the proficiency levels students are expected to meet by:
  - Having teachers participate in the scheduled parent-teacher conferences
  - Providing a copy of the school report card at the beginning of the year
  - Providing a copy of the student-parent handbook at registration
- 5. The <u>Pana Jr. High School</u> will at the request of parents, provide opportunities for regular meetings for parents to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions about the education of their children. The school will respond to any such suggestions as soon as reasonably possible by:
  - Parent-teacher conferences in the Fall and Spring
  - Parent suggestion opportunity at meetings
- 6. The **Pana Jr. High School** will provide each parent an individual student report about the performance of their child on the State assessment in at least math and language arts by:
  - Supplying a copy of student results of the IAR in student report cards or during Student Led Conferences at the end of the first quarter
- 7. The **Pana Jr. High School** will take the following actions to provide each parent/guardian timely notice when their child has been assigned or has been taught for four (4) or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not highly qualified within the

meaning of the term in section 200.56 of the Title I Final Regulations (67 Fed. Reg. 71710, December 2, 2002) by: All teachers are highly qualified.

- 8. The **Pana Jr. High School** will provide assistance to parents/guardians of children served by the school, as appropriate, in understanding topics by undertaking the actions described in this paragraph --
  - "The state's academic content standards,
  - The state's student academic achievement standards.
  - The state and local academic assessments including alternate assessments,
  - The requirements of Part A,
  - " How to monitor their child's progress, and
  - " How to work with educators
- 9. The **Pana Jr. High School** will provide materials and training to help parents/guardians work with their children to improve their children's academic achievement, such as literacy training and using technology, as appropriate, to foster family engagement, by:
  - Providing materials to parents on a variety of academic issues
  - " Offering parent meetings on a variety of school related topics
  - " Having a list of parent resources and weekly assignments available on the Pana Schools website (www.panaschools.com)
- 10. The <u>Pana Jr. High School</u> will, with the assistance of its parents/guardians, educate its teachers, pupil services personnel, principals and other staff in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents/guardians as equal partners in the value and utility of contributions of parents/guardians, and in how to implement and coordinate parent/guardian programs and build ties between parents/guardians and schools, by:
- " Making staff education a key priority for district Professional Development Committee
- Seeking quality research-based programming to in-service staff and/or parents/guardians
- 11. The <u>Pana Jr. High School</u> will, to the extent feasible and appropriate, coordinate and integrate family engagement programs and activities with Head Start, Reading First, Early Reading First, Even Start, Home Instruction Programs for

Preschool Youngsters, the Parents as Teachers Program, public preschool, and other programs. The school will also conduct other activities, such as parent/guardian resource centers, that encourage and support parents/guardians in more fully participating in the education of their children, by:

- " Inviting parents to Fall Open House
- Inviting parents to Fall and Spring Parent-Teacher Conferences
- 12. The <u>Pana Jr. High School</u> will take the following actions to ensure that information related to the school and parent/guardian-programs, meetings, and other activities is sent to parents/guardians of participating children in an understandable and uniform format, including alternative formats upon request, and, to the extent practicable, in a language the parents/guardians can understand:
- Sending home an invitation sheet asking for parents to participate
- Posting upcoming events on the district website
