ATTENDANCE:

The district's attendance rate for the first week of school from 8/9/22 to 4/3/23 is 78.89%. Deering is our high at 85.44%, followed by Buckland and JNES.

<u>ENROLLMENT</u>: Current enrollment as of April 3, 2023 K-12's current enrollment is 1886, a decrease by one student since last reported. PreK – 12 enrollment is 1972, a decrease of two students over last month.

<u>Superintendent's Legislative Fly-in</u> February 25-28, 2023, We heard from legislators and legislative staff, issues, challenges, programs, and bills were discussed and an updated provided. Met with legislators that we did not get the chance to visit with during the AASB fly-in.

<u>Kivalina Site Visit</u> March 15, 2023, Met with City, IRA, and ASC combined to discuss how things were currently going with the school. We also discussed the upcoming Grand Opening. Kivalina Grand Opening has been postponed to a later date in the fall. We are looking at some time in September. Some reasons are, that we do not know if the road will be open due to the number of storms we've been receiving, Bering may not be able to bring everyone over and back in one day, and with the legislative session still going on, many people will not be able to attend. We need to plan for a time in September that will work for everyone.
