Graduation Matters

Though our fastest month of the year, we accomplished a lot as a first grade team. On December 9th we held our second MTSS meeting of the year to review progress monitoring data and make Tier 2 instructional decisions as a group. We had a lot to celebrate at that meeting. In the fall, only 4 first grade students were at a mastery level in letter knowledge. After three 10-day PDSA Intervention cycles, and consistent Tier 1 instruction in phonics, we now have 43 students at the mastery level in letter knowledge.

This is a huge increase, and our team is very proud. Teams worked together to make intervention plans for the next three 10-day reading intervention cycles, and recorded their plans on PDSAs for implementation. We are excited to be able to move into the 1st grade Phonics curriculum in our Tier 1 program after the break!

We also worked with Mary Buck to come up with a progress monitoring plan and schedule for math so teachers will be monitoring student progress using probes from Aimsweb every 10 days as well. Teachers were part of coming up with the schedule and have already recorded some good data that will be used to drive instruction. We are excited to see how students will progress in the areas of Number Naming Fluency, Number Comparison Fluency, and Math Facts with 1-Digit numbers.

Though short, this month has been very busy, but the first grade team has done an amazing job juggling all the things December brings while still making great instructional decisions for their students.
