BHS Human Rights Club Sidwell Trip

Description of the trip and the collaboration between BHS and Sidwell:

In the spring of 2016 the BHS librarian, Amy Andreas, was introduced to Mr. Philip McAdoo, Director of Equity, Justice, and Community at the Sidwell Friends School in Washington, DC. Sidwell is a small, private school with a long list of well known notable Alumni (Malia Obama, Chelsea Clinton, Amy Carter, Albert Gore). Former President Barak Obama's youngest daughter currently attends the school. Needless to say, it is an excellent, diverse school with a solid international reputation.

Mr. McAdoo and Mrs. Andreas discussed developing a cultural exchange program for the students of both schools. In preparation for this learning experience, Mrs. Andreas started up Human Rights Club at BHS. The students that have joined this club meet to explore issues of human rights, here in our community, the nation, and the world at large.
