

# Safety Matters

In addition to parent support, Conscious Discipline also offers social-emotional resources for students. At KW/Vina students have been introduced to the Feelings Buddies in our PreK program, and continued to receive support in Kindergarten and in 1st grade through our Tier II social-emotional intervention groups. In the Conscious Discipline Feelings Buddies Program students learn to identify their emotions, make I Feel statements, and resolve those feelings by learning calming and communication strategies. All students received the How do you feel? card in



their student backpacks this month.

With our Ipad distribution at KW/Vina complete, we can now begin preparing for synchronous small group instruction. To ensure that "Safety Matters" even in a virtual classroom, the MBI and grade-level teams have worked to create virtual classroom learning expectations to support teachers with classroom management and ensure the virtual safety of our students. Visuals and video lessons will be created to teach students and families about the virtual classroom learning expectations. These lessons will be available on the SeeSaw platform, and will prepare students for small group synchronous instruction beginning in December.

#### Positives:

Ipads are here and were distributed November 4th-6th! Our students and families were eager to pick up their Ipads and backpacks filled with grade-level learning materials and school supplies. Our teachers have been busy pre recording instructional lessons, and these finally have a home on our Digital Learning Platform, SeeSaw and are available for ALL kids!

#### Challenges:

A challenge at KW/Vina this month was the number of families with COVID in the home. Many families are recovering, but for some Coronavirus has had devastating results. Our teachers are continuing to communicate with families each week about their needs well beyond the academic needs for students. We have been able to connect families to additional meals, as well as lend a good listening ear for those who are struggling with isolation. Even in this challenging time, our teachers have done an amazing job supporting families.

### **Graduation Matters**

We have some data! Our big project in October was to figure out how to assess remotely. With Aimsweb, assessments are given one-on-one at the K-1 level. This is a major improvement from previous years where the ISIP and STAR math assessments were taken on the computer. We have always struggled watching young children take an assessment on the computer because there is so much management to try to keep them engaged with the screen. We are so excited to be able to conduct benchmark assessing and progress monitoring one-on-one. This way, we know that what the student shows us is what they know how to do.

With our current situation, however, when being in the same space as a person is not an option, we had to figure out another way.

In September, the coaches and principals attended a webinar Aimsweb put on to learn about remote assessing with the DRF (digital record form) that K and 1 use. Using our new information we developed a plan to roll this out with our staff. I piloted the first assessment, and with the permission of the family, I was able to record the assessment session as a training tool for teachers. Our staff were all trained in administering the

assessment virtually and we planned ways to incorporate our "Big Bang Strategies" to keep children engaged like using a visual schedule, virtual stickers, incorporating breaks, and having clear expectations for the student and for the assistant proctor, the parent. After the first couple weeks of assessing, the feedback is very positive. Teachers are happy to be engaging with their students, and we are getting some good data to drive our instruction. So far, and as expected with students unable to be in an actual classroom since March, we have many students below average in both reading and math, and we are working on ways to meet these needs in small groups. We are so excited to be distributing ipads the first week of November, and really getting things going for our students.

The 1st grader Immersion students are saying a virtual prayer for our community, children, and elders. The class has been meeting every Thursday. They have been practicing the Blackfeet prayer and each student was designated a word to practice and record. This was a group effort and they are all really excited to see the finished product. The virtual prayer is praying to bless everyone on the Blackfeet Reservation, to help keep us strong everyday and keep our lives happy.

Our students miss seeing their classmates' faces and teachers so meeting with them once a week gives them some interaction and these meetings are something they really look forward to. They were excited to be a part of this virtual prayer that will be shared at the November 24th board meeting.


#### (Shaylea Tatsey First Grade BNAS)

In 1st grade BNAS, I have recorded videos from home. I went back to teaching family names of those who take care of us and the students were to draw a moyiss (tipi) of them and their caretakers. I then recorded a video on animal names here on our Blackfeet Reservation, and showed them the Blackfeet App they can download for their at home use. The students were to draw the animals or cut and paste onto a picture of chief mountain with their labels. Since we have been in the process of getting our ipads, I recorded a video on color names in Blackfeet and numbers 1-20. We will than move into identifying how many animals/things, or what color is this animal, so students are viewing these videos for two weeks. I know a lot of parents have access to Facebook, so I created a Ms. Tatsey's BNAS FB Page where I post short videos related to my lesson. This is also an outlet for parents/quardians have shared their students work with me.

































(Tammy Hall-Reagan Guidance Counselor )
