




Questions

- Should we be following up with 9th grade males to determine the decline in the number of students with postsecondary plans? What does other mean for the 10% of 9th grade males?




Overall, adults at my school treat students fairly




Adults at my school listen to the students




At my school teachers care about the students




Most teachers at my school are interested in me as a person




Knew there was a School Resource Officer (New question 2016)




I feel safe at school





Current Mental Health/Treatment Trends

- ▶ 2015/2016 saw an increase of 29% of those students needing and requiring the support of care and treatment and out of district placement as compared to the school year 2012/2013.
- We do not have data on partial day and chemical dependency treatment taking place outside of school hours

- Specifically the high school had 13 students requiring day treatment programming last year for depression, anxiety and suicidal ideation.
- Low Incidence
 - Suicide
 - Elementary Day Treatment
 - Eating Disorders

- From the fall of 2011 to spring of 2016 we had no students attending the Northeast Metro 916 Alternative Learning Program (ALP). The ALP program placement is acquired through reserved slots that the district pays for in advance whether the slot is used or not.
- We currently have two students utilizing the program at a significant cost to the district. Both students have been in and out of incarceration on numerous occasions.

- Since the 2011/2012 school year, the District has typically placed one to two students in Northeast Metro 916 Project Return.
- ▶ Project Return is a restorative justice educational program for out of school suspension and the program typically runs for up to 45 school days. (Last year we had one student attend.)

- High school utilized DEC once as well as the Middle School (Diagnostic Evaluation Center)
- Canvas Health Mobile Crises Unit was used on several occasions at the high school, at least once at the Middle School, and I believe more than once at OH Anderson.

Kevin Horst, psychologist, from the Mental Health Crisis Team from 916, was accessed at least four times last year for student intervention at the elementary level.
