Every Day Matters!

Ms. H's Counseling Corner

As we step into May, the home stretch of the school year is in sight! It's hard to believe how quickly this year has flown by! For many students, May can bring excitement—and sometimes a little nervousness—about the changes ahead. Whether they're moving up to a new grade or heading to middle school, we'll be



discussing what to expect and how to cope with those "big feelings," by using our Tools. We will review and practice them this month and into June.

My classroom lessons this month will focus on building our friendship skills and how to communicate with a friend when there is a disagreement. We will be taking a closer look at our Words Tool and using the 4 keys to communication. Using an "I" message helps students develop effective communication skills, express their feelings without blame, and foster positive interactions.

In the final weeks of May we will do some career awareness activities. It might seem early, but introducing career concepts at a young age builds curiosity, encourages goal setting, and promotes self-awareness. We're not asking students to choose a career path just yet-but rather sparking inspiration and showing them that their passions and talents can grow into something meaningful.

PE with Mrs. B!

During the month of April, students at GGS have learned to play the classic game of kickball! I like to introduce this game in the original form and then build in different versions such as continuous kickball and ultimate kickball. Students learn the basics of baseball through playing kickball. Secondly, students

worked on their dexterity and coordination with cup stacking. Cup stacking uses special plastic cups with holes on the bottom to make different formations of cups. We used cup stacking mats with timers and played games using our stacking skills. Ask your child about cup stacking!

BALLOT MEASURE #29-184



PROPOSED LOCAL OPTION LEVY

What is Measure 29-184?

Measure 29-184 is a proposed local option levy which was referred to the voters by the Neah-Kah-Nie School Board. If passed the measure would authorize an increase in property taxes that would be used to fund District operations. This measure will appear on all voters' ballots in the District boundaries for the May 20, 2025 election.

If passed, what would the measure cost?

If the measure passes, property owners within the District would pay \$0.75 per \$1,000 of assessed property value. The owner of a home assessed at \$250,000 would pay \$ 5.48 more per month or \$ 65.76 more per year. The property tax would continue for five years and would raise a total of \$11,040,000.

What happens if Measure 29-184 is passed by voters?

If passed by voters on May 20, the Measure would raise property tax revenue estimated at \$11 million over five years. The tax revenue would fund:

- Teachers and staff Transportation Meals Extracurricular Activities
- Maintain small class sizes
- Maintain programs such as the arts, athletics, career-technical education, dual credit programs, and district transportation

What would happen if Measure 29-184 is not passed by voters?

If the measure does not pass, the above operational priorities would not be funded and property taxes would not be increased. The current property tax expires in June 2025.
