Wanted to align the procedures to our beliefs.


Provide students with more accountability and ownership.

## Data from the Student Perspective


- Results from 1,827 responses
- The greatest number of students who reassess are underclassmen
- More general ed students are taking advantage of reassessment than honors students
- Less students chose to reassess this year than last year
- A majority of students who choose to reassess hope to have greater success on the reassessment
- Why are students not choosing to reassess?



- I make good grades the first time
- I don't complete my minor assignments (ineligible because I don't complete my work)
- I don't want to
- I'm too busy

## Data from Teacher Perspective

Because of the new procedures, do you feel students are more prepared the first time they take an assessment (major or minor)? (Compared to previous years.)



- Based on 126 responses
- Teachers agree that reassessment has gone down since last year.
- They assign this to the formative work expectation AND the fact that students are <u>MORE</u> prepared for the initial assessment.
- Several things are apparent from these number and the individual responses.
