Agenda Item: Consider Approval of the Competitive Procurement Threshold Policy in CH Local

Summary:

Senate Bill 1173 (SB 1173) in Texas raises the competitive procurement threshold for certain political subdivisions from \$50,000 to \$100,000. This means that when these entities purchase goods or services, they will only be required to use a competitive bidding process for purchases exceeding \$100,000, rather than the previous \$50,000 limit. The bill aims to modernize procurement standards and reduce administrative burdens by reflecting the increased cost of goods and services.

Purpose:

The primary goal of SB 1173 is to modernize procurement standards, streamline processes, and reduce administrative costs for local governments.

Impact:

By raising the threshold, local school districts will have more flexibility in purchasing goods and services below \$100,000 without needing to go through the competitive bidding process.

Effective Date:

The changes apply to purchases made on or after the bill's effective date, which is September 1, 2025.
