Attendance

For the month of January our student attendance was 82 % overall. Below is a break down by grade level.

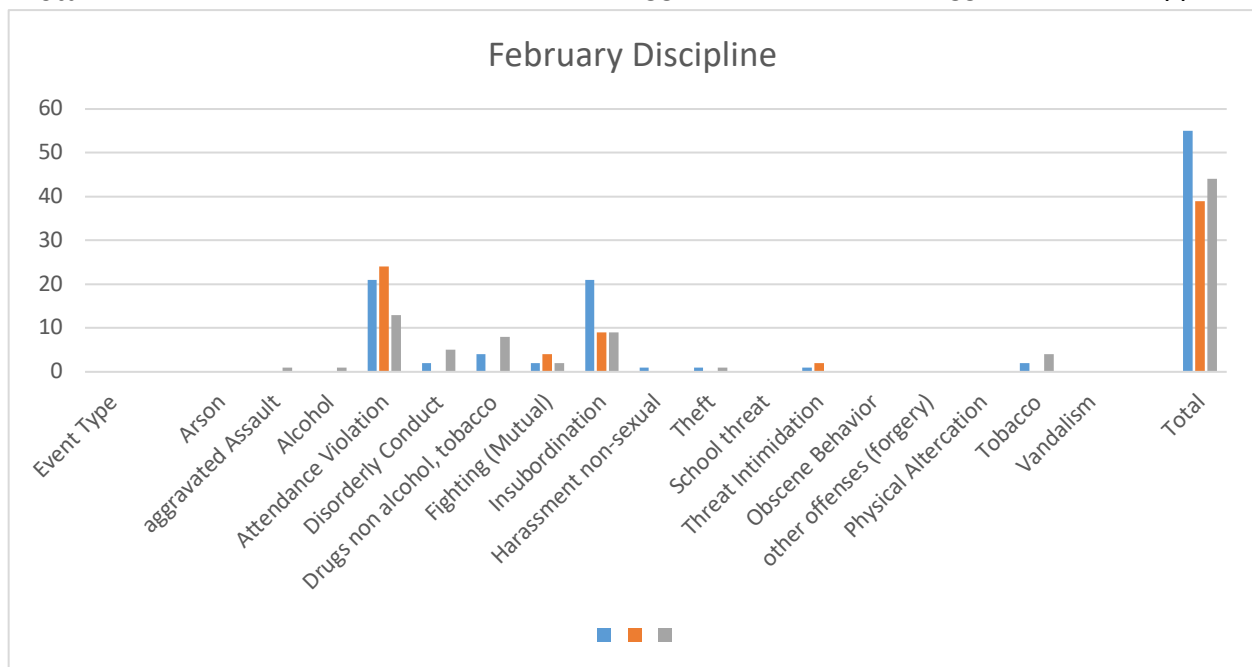
Discipline

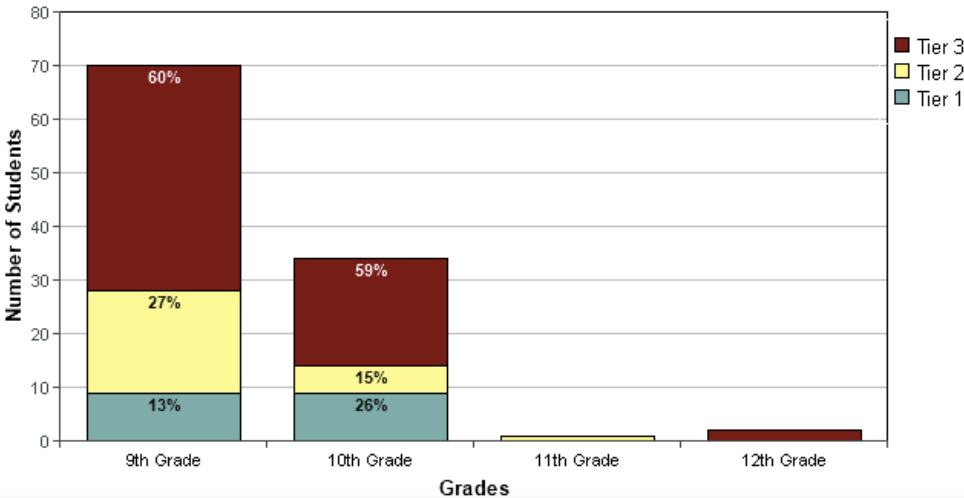
Data

at Browning Public Schools - 2018/2019 School Year

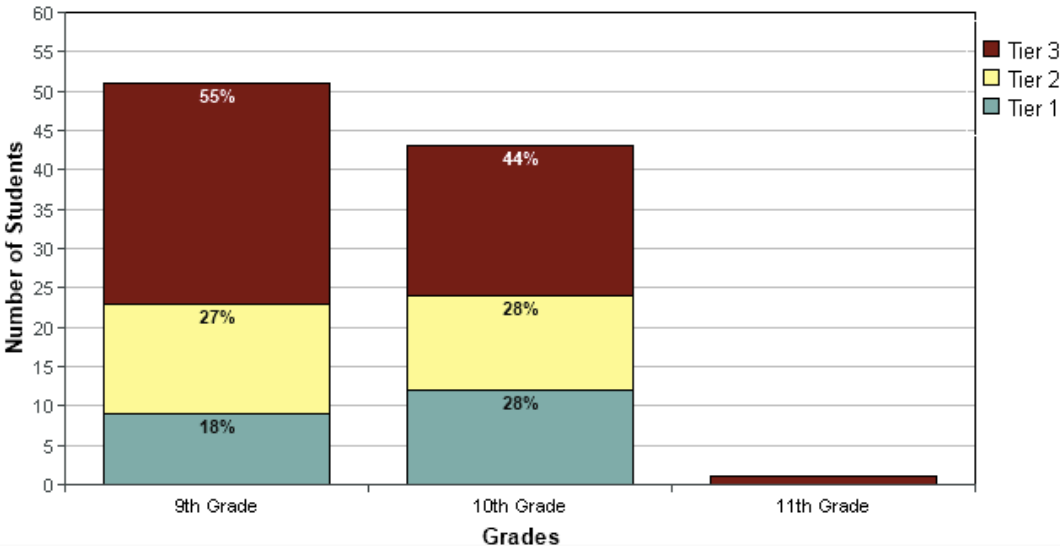
All Grades - December 2018

Challenges

We are continuing to monitor our single lunch period. (i.e. tardies). Amy Andreas has offered to provide concessions during lunch. They will be offering smoothies and cup of soup as well as other things.
