Educational Plan Development: Beginning their 7th grade year, with adult guidance, and reviewed at least annually, students will develop an educational plan. The educational plan is a “road map” that guides the student’s learning through high school and prepares him or her for a successful transition to next steps after high school on course as he or she monitors progress and adjusts the educational plan as needed.

- Educational 4 year plan *
- Career Search*
- Secondary School Search*
- Short term goals, Grade level goals 7-12 updated annually
- Long term goals, Five years after Graduation

Educational Profile Development: Beginning their 7th grade year, with adult guidance, and reviewed at least annually, students will develop an educational profile. The educational profile serves as a “compass” that documents progress and achievement toward a student’s goals and helps that student stay on course as he or she monitors progress and adjusts the educational plan as needed.

- Transcripts
- CIM scores
- Best Work Samples
- Portfolio Progress Check List

Extended Application Standards: Students build a collection of evidence, or include evidence in existing collections, to demonstrate extended academic and career-related knowledge and skills in new and complex situations.

- Senior presentation of portfolio

Career Related Standards: Students demonstrate career-related knowledge and skills in personal management, problem solving, communication, teamwork, employment foundations, and career development.

1. **Personal Management:** Exhibit appropriate work ethics and behaviors in school, community, and/or workplace.

***Students will select 5 of the 8 options**

- Voter’s registration
- Draft registration
- Driver’s license
- CPR/First Aid Card
- Food Handler’s Card
- 10 hours of Community Service
- Awards
- Jobs skills survey (employer or volunteer experience filled out)

2. **Problem Solving:** Apply decision-making and problem-solving techniques in school, community, and/or workplace.

Required:

- Test scores/apptitude test scores (ASVAB, PSAT, SAT, etc.)
- Occupational Project or Vocational Project *Photos and summary of project

3. **Communication:** Demonstrate effective and appropriate communication skills to give and receive information in school, community, and/or workplace.

Required:

- Mission Statement
- Letters of Recommendation
- College or Trade School Application
- Scholarship Application

4. **Teamwork:** Demonstrate effective teamwork in school, community, and/or workplace.

***Students will select 2 of the 4 options**

- Teamwork essay
- Cooperative learning project *approved by advisor
- Letter or participation award in club, activity or athletics
- Organize a school event *approved by advisor

5. **Employment Foundations:** Demonstrate academic, technical, and organizational knowledge and skills required for successful employment.

Required:

- Job application
- Resume*
- Cover letter for job application

***Students will select 1 of the 2 options**

- 6 hour job shadow with evaluation form (1 from junior and senior year)
- School attendance essay

6. **Career Development:** Demonstrate career development skills in planning for post-high school experiences.

***Students will select 3 from the following options**

- Financial Aid Application
- College or trade school application
- College visitation
- College fair
- College/Career Field trip
- Post Secondary presentation with reflection
- Post Secondary/Military Experience *approved by advisor

Career Related Learning Experiences: Students participate in career-related learning experiences as outlined in the educational plan, identify learning outcomes, and reflect on learning.

Required

- Senior Exit Interview
- Senior Career research paper (8-10 pages typed)
- Written 13 Year Plan (3-5 pages typed)
