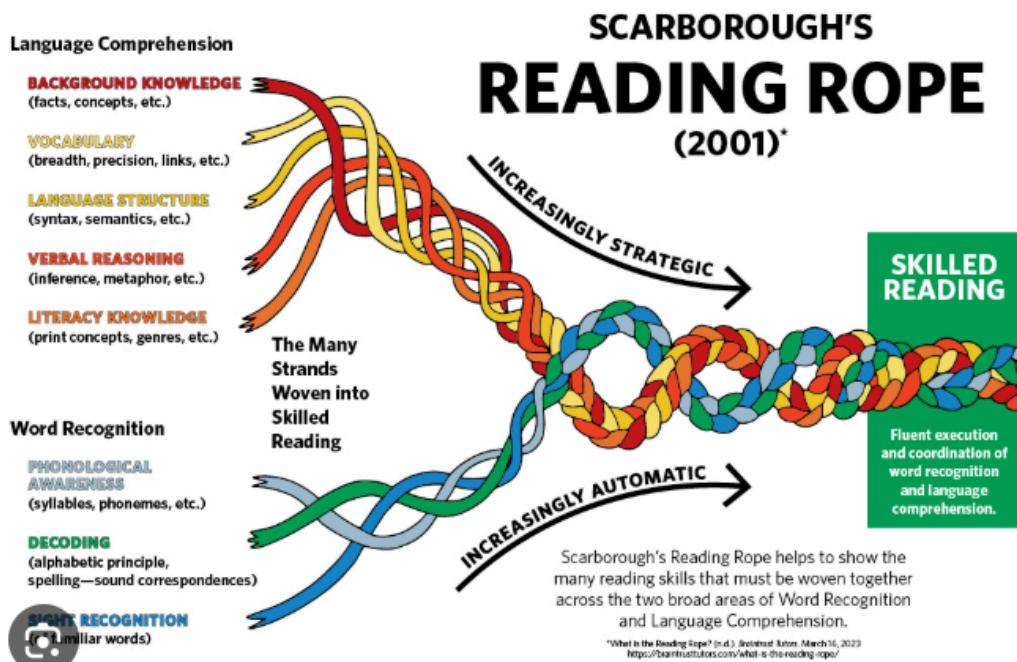

PRINCIPAL's UPDATE 12/15/25

- Current Enrollment 102 students (with three new registrants expected when we return in January).
- Family literacy night was well attended with approximately 58 participants. Families enjoyed dinner and hot chocolate. Ms. Johannesmeyer provided a presentation on the strands of literacy using the Scarborough Model



Participants were released to eight educational stations/classrooms to engage in a fun activity that highlighted each strand of the reading rope. Our students collected tickets from each station that were turned in at the end of the evening to enter a raffle for several literacy prize baskets.
