#### Kaleidoscope Play and Learn Group

Kaleidoscope Play and Learn brings together young children and their caregivers in facilitated play groups. It is designed to provide support and information to children's parents and caregivers to what they can do at home to support early learning, child development, and kindergarten readiness skills. During our play & learn group, parents and caregivers stay and are involved throughout the session. We talk about what children are learning and how it connects to school readiness. Families play together using different household materials, toys, blocks, and such so that young children are getting great early learning experiences while families are learning what they can do at home using materials they would find in their closets, cupboards, and kitchen drawers. At the end of each session, each child receives a "take-away" related to the daily theme. This might be a storybook, flashcards, ABC/number magnets, crayons, etc. This year's group consisted of an average of 12 families including 13 children ages 3-5. During the end of the year celebration, children received a backpack full of books and learning materials. Parents also received a tote with storybooks, and activity book, writing matt, and other learning tools for their children to work on over the summer.

### **Kinder Bound After School Kindergarten Readiness Class**

Kinder Bound is a 10 week long comprehensive program that engaged pre-kindergarteners in a variety of activities that targeted pre-literacy skills, math readiness, language and communication skills, fine and gross motor skills, and social and emotional development. These lessons supported students by reinforcing the knowledge, understanding, and the basic skills needed as they transition from pre-school or home to kindergarten. This year's class consisted of 12 students eager and ready to be Eagles. At the end of the year celebration, each student received a new backpack filled with the school supplies needed for kindergarten.







