ACCT 2201	Accounting I: Financial Accounting	4	Northwest Technical College		This course is an introduction to the fundamental accounting concepts and principles used to analyze and record business transactions. Topics include the accounting cycle, accounting for a merchandising business, accounting system design, inventory and depreciation methods, calculating payroll. Prerequisite(s): None
ACCT 2203	Accounting II: Managerial Accounting	4	Northwest Technical College		This course introduces the student to the business concepts and methods used to report managerial performance information to internal users. This information is used for decision-making, production management, product design and pricing, marketing, and evaluating employees. Students will focus on analysis and recording of various manufacturing costs, cost-volume-profit analysis, preparation of financial statements for a manufacturer, creation of static and flexible budgets and reports, evaluation of capital investments, and various costing systems.
AGRG 1100	Intro to Agriculture	3	Northland Community & Tech College		Students will learn and understand different facets of the Agriculture, Food and Natural Resources (AFNR). Students will explore the AFNR community at the local, state, national and world wide levels. Prerequisite: None
ANSC 1350	Companion Animals	3	Northland Community & Tech College		This course will cover the essentials of companion animal care. Students will study terminology, breeds, handling, safety, selection, nutrition, health and disease, genetics, and reproduction of companion animals. Prerequisite: None.
ANTH 1110	Cultural Anthropology	3	Northwest Technical College	02 – Critical Thinking 05 – Hist/Soc/Behav Sci	The course is meant to introduce learners both to the diversity of human cultures, to the diversity within each of them, with an emphasis on so-called traditional societies. It looks at the major human institutions: kinship and marriage, economic production and reciprocity, gender and domestic relations, political power and forms of stratification, religious and healing beliefs and techniques, rites of passage and the life cycle. It attempts to make sense of cultural relativity: how seemingly very different customs or institutions can actually be so similar, in structure or function; but also how apparently very similar institutions can, in different societies, be in fact so different.
BIOL 1101	Concepts of Biology	4	Northland Community & Tech College	03 – Natural Science 10 – People/Environment	Introduces non-science majors to the basic concepts of biology. Topics will include, but are not limited to, cell structure and function, genetics, hereditary and evolution, the diversity of life; including plants, animals, and microorganisms, and ecology. Lecture and lab. Prerequisites: None
BIOL 1111	Biological Prin I	4	Northland Community & Tech College	03 – Natural Science 10 – People/Environment	This is an introductory level course where students study fundamental concepts of cell biology, the chemical and physical basis of life, concepts in genetics, evolution, and the impact that biological and genetic advances have on society and the biosphere. This course includes 3 lecture hours and 2 lab hours per week. Prerequisites: None

BIOL 1112	Biological Prin II	4	Northland Community & Tech College	03 – Natural Science 10 – People/Environment	This is an introductory level course that introduces the concepts of macroevolution, the 6 kingdoms system of classification, comparative study of representatives of the 6 kingdoms with special emphasis on plants and animals, the concept of biomes, and the role of human activities and their affects on the ecological balance of the biosphere. This course includes 3 lecture hours and 2 lab hours per week. Prerequisites: None
BIOL 2130	Principles of Nutrition	3	Northwest Technical College	03 – Natural Science	Principles of Nutrition provides an introduction to the basic concepts related to nutrients in foods and their metabolic functions. The course will also focus on methods for assessing nutritional status and dietary adequacy, as well as its applications to phases of the human life cycle. <u>Prerequisite(s): None</u>
BIOL 2221	Microbiology	3	Northwest Technical College	03 – Natural Science	This course is an introduction to fundamental theories, principles and methods of microbiology. Structure, function, effects of physical factors, and inhibition and killing of microorganisms will be studied. Microbial interactions with humans and their immune system are introduced. Students are familiarized with the concepts of medical and environmental microbiology and microbial diversity, as well as the necessary laboratory techniques needed to study those organisms. This course includes a laboratory component. <u>Prerequisite: None</u>
BIOL 2260	Anatomy and Phys I	4	Northland Community & Tech College	03 – Natural Science	This is an introductory level course where students study fundamental concepts of cell biology, the chemical and physical basis of life, concepts in genetics, evolution, and the impact that biological and genetic advances have on society and the biosphere. This course includes 3 lecture hours and 2 lab hours per week. Prerequisites: None
BIOL 2262	Anatomy and Phys II	4	Northland Community & Tech College	03 – Natural Science	This is an advanced course that acquaints students with the structure, function, and disease processes of nerve tissue, central nervous, endocrine, digestion, nutrition, urinary, reproduction, development and genetic systems in the human body. Prerequisite: None.
BUS 2220	Principles of Management	3	Alexandria Tech & Community College		Learners gain an understanding of business management concepts and the history of management. The learner explores the changing environment of business and its effect on business and managerial processes.
CHEM 1100	Intro to Chemistry	4	Northwest Technical College	03 – Natural Science	This course is designed to provide the learner with an understanding of principles and theories of chemistry, atomic and molecular structure, elements, compounds, mixtures, the periodic table, the nature of gasses, liquids and solid states, chemical reactions and stoichiometry. This course includes a laboratory component. <u>Prerequisite(s): MATH0081 or appropriate placement scores</u>
COMM 1415	Public Speaking	3	Alexandria Tech & Community College	01 – Communication	This course covers the theories, practices, and methods of public speaking, group problem solving, critical listening, and critiquing. The focus in this course is on the concepts of planning and delivering oral presentations and enhancing learner listening skills.

COMM 1435	Interpersonal Communication	3	Alexandria Tech & Community College	01 – Communication	This course meets Minnesota Transfer Curriculum (MnTC) goal area 1. This course assists students in improving their one-on-one communication skills at both a professional and personal level. Learners analyze the common variables of interpersonal communications and learn techniques to overcome barriers to effective communication.
COMM 1485	Social Media Communication	3	Alexandria Tech & Community College	01 – Communication 09 – Ethical/Civic Resp	This course examines the history, rise, and growth of social media in the 21st century. Students will study how social media impacts communication in our social, political, and cultural worlds. Students will develop an understanding of effective and ethical communication practices with a variety of interactive web tools such as Facebook, X, YouTube, Instagram, Snapchat, blogs, and podcasts.
COMM 2409	Communication and Films We Watch	3	Alexandria Tech & Community College	06 – Humanities/Fine Arts	This course examines how our communication is influenced through film. The course will challenge students to develop skills of perceptive viewing of films while providing students the ability to discuss the impact rhetoric has in films. Students will be required to watch several films throughout the course, participate actively in discussions and write critically about the films, both informally and formally.
CRLT 2103	Job Seeking-Keeping	1	Northland Community & Tech College		This course covers such contemporary career topics as employer expectations, job market trends, networking, and various aspects of the employment search process, including legal and ethical issues. To apply their knowledge of the employment process, students develop resumes, letters, and applications, as well as identify and use effective interviewing techniques. This course emphasizes a comprehensive knowledge of career processes that will serve students throughout their working lives. Prerequisites: None
ECED 1210	Learning Environments & Creative Activities	3	Alexandria Tech & Community College		This course examines the role of adults in providing physical and social learning environments, positive interactions, and developmentally appropriate practices (DAP) activities that support learning and creativity in the early childhood years. It applies the knowledge of child development as it relates to individual children, families, and communities. The nature and importance of play as a vehicle for child learning is addressed as well as implementation of developmentally and culturally appropriate practices. The importance of child choice and active exploration as strategies to meet appropriate goals for learning and development are stressed.
ECED 2110	Child and Family Relations in a Diverse World	3	Alexandria Tech & Community College		This course helps professionals working with young children increase their understanding of diverse families and provides an opportunity to examine how current societal and community issues impact the development of children and the well-being of families. Students will examine the types of stressors that families face, as well as the importance of forging effective partnerships with families and the community organizations and resources available to support them.

ECON 1404	Consumer Economics and Finance	3	Alexandria Tech & Community College	05 – Hist/Soc/Behav Sci 09 – Ethical/Civic Resp	Economics is the study of financial decision making. This course covers income and financial planning. A personal financial plan is developed to include asset acquisition, risk management, investment and retirement planning, and budgeting.
ECON 2202	Macroeconomics	3	Northland Community & Tech College	05 – Hist/Soc/Behav Sci	This course is a study of National economies with an emphasis on such problems as the rate of unemployment, the changing level of prices, the nation's total output of goods and services and international monetary policies and exchange rate. Prerequisites: None
EDUC 1400	Introduction to Education	3	Alexandria Tech & Community College		An introduction to the philosophical and historical foundations of education, as well as the social, legal, and ethical issues in contemporary and diverse learning environments. This course will include a 30 hour classroom observation.
ENGL 1126	Intro to Literature	3	Northland Community & Tech College	06 – Humanities/Fine Arts	This course includes the reading of literature, such as poetry, short stories and drama, and the writing of critical essays. Prerequisites: None
ENGL 1410	Composition I	3	Alexandria Tech & Community College	01 – Communication 02 – Critical Thinking	This course deals with the fundamentals of expository writing based on reading or personal experience. It stresses organization, the process of writing, English grammar, mechanics, and style. Emphasis is on the strategies of exposition as well as effective description and narration. This course offers students an introduction to the academic research process, as well. Students learn the process method of writing that can be utilized in business, academic, and creative writing. Prerequisite: College level writing score on a placement test or a minimum grade of C in ENGL0900 (College Prep Writing).
ENGL 1420	Composition II	3	Alexandria Tech & Community College	01 – Communication 02 – Critical Thinking	This course is a continuation of Composition I (ENGL1410), with stress on analytical writing, research, and documentation of supporting evidence. Learners write critical analysis, cause/effect, and persuasive essays. Prerequisite: ENGL1410.
ENGL 2203	Creative Writing	3	Northland Community & Tech College	06 – Humanities/Fine Arts	Directive practice in writing biography/autobiography, children's stories, short stories, poetry, and drama. Prerequisites: ENGL0095
GEOG 1471	World Regional Geography	3	Alexandria Tech & Community College	05 – Hist/Soc/Behav Sci 08 – Global Perspective	This course is intended to give the learner a broad overview of selected general geographic regions of the world and the discipline of geography.
HIST 1401	U.S. History to 1877	3	Alexandria Tech & Community College	05 – Hist/Soc/Behav Sci 07A – Human Diversity	This course is an overview of American history from the time of earliest colonization to 1877. Interpretations focus on the political, social, economic, and cultural development of the United States. Course time is also be spent analyzing the role of the United States in the development of other regions of the world during this time period.
HIST 1402	U.S. History, 1877 to Present	3	Alexandria Tech & Community College	05 – Hist/Soc/Behav Sci 07A – Human Diversity	This course is an overview of United States history from the year 1877 to the present. Interpretations focus on the political, social, economic, and cultural development of the United States in this time period. Focus is on issues defined by industrial production, challenges to traditional ways of thinking about democracy, and the effects of nuclear weaponry on political and social realities.

HIST 1421	World History to 1500	3	Alexandria Tech & Community College	05 – Hist/Soc/Behav Sci 08 – Global Perspective	This course is designed to provide an overview of world history from antiquity to 1500. Interpretations will focus on the political, social, economic, and cultural development of the World Civilizations.
HIST 1422	World History - 1500 to Present	3	Alexandria Tech & Community College	05 – Hist/Soc/Behav Sci 08 – Global Perspective	This course provides an overview of World history in the time period 1500-the present day. Interpretations focus on political, social, economic, and cultural development of World Civilizations.
HIST 2210	Minnesota History	3	Northland Community & Tech College	05 – Hist/Soc/Behav Sci	The course provides an analysis of Minnesota's past beginning with geologic factors that influenced our heritage, an overview of Native Americans, and developments to the present. Areas covered include the period of French exploration and the fur trade, English domination, Minnesota from territorial status on through modern statehood. Prerequisites: None
HLTH 1000	Introduction to Health Careers	3	Northwest Technical College		Students will explore career options within the fields of allied health. Course content is designed to provide information regarding health careers such as required education, working conditions, and typical salary. Content aims to promote discussion, encourage critical reflection and self-exploration. This course will familiarize students with the historical, philosophical, and social foundations of the health care system and various health careers. Prerequisite(s): None
HLTH 1101	Intro Health Professions	3	Northland Community & Tech College		This course provides the opportunity to explore allied health professions and will prepare the students with the necessary knowledge and skills to make an informed decision in choosing a health field program of study. The students will learn about the requirements, roles and responsibilities of various occupations in the health field through faculty presentations, resource exploration and interviews. Students will explore the various ethical, legal and financial factors influencing the healthcare system and the settings where health professionals are employed. Students will be encouraged to further their knowledge in a particular health career through participation in a shadowing experience or interview of a health professional. Prerequisite: None.
HLTH 1106	Medical Terminology	2	Northland Community & Tech College		This course covers prefixes, suffixes, and word roots used to compose medical terms. Students learn to spell, pronounce, define, analyze, and formulate terminology related to body structure, disease, diagnosis, and treatment. Medical abbreviations are also covered. Prerequisites: None
HUMA 1407	Introduction to the Humanities	3	Alexandria Tech & Community College	06 – Humanities/Fine Arts	This course provides the student with the opportunity to examine and interact with works of art from a variety of disciplines; painting, sculpture, architecture, literature, theater, cinema, and music. This survey will provide tools with which the student may continue to work to provide growth in their personal exploration of their humanness and the quality of their lives; vocabulary and perception.

ITEC 1430	Computer Applications and Technology	3	Alexandria Tech & Community College		<p>This course introduces the components of a personal computer, computer terminology, the internet, email, and the creation of documents, presentations, worksheets, and databases through hands-on experience with the Microsoft Windows operating system and the Microsoft Office Suite (Word, PowerPoint, Excel, Access, and Outlook). This course is designed as a general education course for all learners, regardless of their career choice. This course enhances the learner's knowledge and understanding of computers and their awareness of how computers impact their lives. Required hardware: Windows-based PC required with the operating system Windows 11 Home or Professional or higher. Chromebooks or other Apple devices are not compatible. Required software: Windows 11 Home or Professional or higher and Office 365 or Microsoft Office Professional 2021.</p>
MATH 1111	College Algebra	4	Northland Community & Tech College	04 – Mathematical/Logical Reasoning	<p>This course covers basic algebraic operations, linear and quadratic equations and inequalities, variation, functions and their graphs, binomial expansion, theory of equations, rational equations, conic sections, exponential and logarithmic functions, and systems of equations.</p> <p>Prerequisite(s): Multiple measures assessment.</p>
MATH 1200	Mathematics of Business and Industry	3	Northwest Technical College	04 – Mathematical/Logical Reasoning	<p>A Survey of mathematics consists of the area and volume of geometric figures, right triangle trigonometry with applications, set theory, logical reasoning methods, linear equations/ linear regression, and bank financing.</p> <p>Prerequisite(s): Multiple measures assessment.</p>
MATH 2203	Statistics	4	Northland Community & Tech College	04 – Mathematical/Logical Reasoning	<p>This course covers the basic concepts of elementary statistics, including descriptive statistics, elementary probability, probability distributions, confidence intervals, hypothesis testing, correlation, chi-square tests, ANOVA, statistical inference, and linear and multiple regression. Prerequisites: Multiple measures assessment.</p>
MKTG 2100	Principles of Marketing	3	Northwest Technical College		<p>This course introduces learners to the dynamic field of marketing. This course is a comprehensive study of the marketing principles and concepts and their application to a changing business world.</p> <p>Prerequisite(s): None</p>
MUSC 1210	Rock Music thru Time	3	Northland Community & Tech College	06 – Humanities/Fine Arts 07B - Race-Power-Justice	<p>This introductory course focuses on American Rock music starting in the 1950's through to today and spends time on what led to the birth of Rock n Roll as well as its global offspring, especially from England. Music will be discussed within the social and historical context of diverse cultures in America and the development of diverse musical aesthetics with particular emphasis placed on the impact that African American men and women had on its development.</p> <p>Prerequisite: None</p>

MUSC 1230	Country Music History	3	Northland Community & Tech College	06 – Humanities/Fine Arts 07A – Human Diversity	This introductory course focuses on American Rock music starting in the 1950's through to today and spends time on what led to the birth of Rock n Roll as well as its global offspring, especially from England. Music will be discussed within the social and historical context of diverse cultures in America and the development of diverse musical aesthetics with particular emphasis placed on the impact that African American men and women had on its development. Prerequisite: None
MUSC 2510	Music Around the World	3	Northland Community & Tech College	06 – Humanities/Fine Arts 08 – Global Perspective	Music exists in every culture ever studies. This class looks at a variety of culture groups from around the world, studying music pieces within the context of the groups' beliefs, uses, and purposes for that music as well as its historical, religious, or political context. Music terminology will be introduced to describe what is heard including addressing the basic music elements (rhythm, harmony, timbre, melody, and texture) and several new instruments that will be investigated throughout the course. This is an enjoyable, nonthreatening way to learn a little bit about the world around you and its people. Prerequisite: None.
NSCI 1123	Astronomy	4	Northland Community & Tech College	03 – Natural Science	This is a survey course in descriptive and modern astronomy, including a study of solar system and stellar formation, star and galaxy evolution, cosmology and study of the universe. Lecture and lab. Prerequisites: None
NSCI 2203	Environmental Science	4	Northwest Technical College	03 – Natural Science 10 – People/Environment	This introductory course addresses the dynamic equilibrium of our environment. The design of the course is to teach the science behind the environmental issues on our planet. This will allow for discussion and analysis of current topic related to those issues. Lecture and lab. Prerequisites: None
PHED 1505	Personal Health and Wellness	2	Alexandria Tech & Community College		This course will provide an overview of health, wellness, and fitness topics. The course will explore and discuss several current issues related to those concepts including identification and awareness of social health problems and possible strategies for addressing those concerns. Students will examine how lifestyle choices/habits affect health and well-being, and develop an understanding of techniques/procedures to initiate healthy change, including study and reflection on three primary areas of fitness. Class participants will be required to assess their personal health/fitness needs and goals, and design methods to experience positive change. Active and consistent attempts to implement those individual plans will be demonstrated and evaluated.
PHIL 1445	Ethics	3	Alexandria Tech & Community College	06 – Humanities/Fine Arts 09 – Ethical/Civic Resp	The course introduces learners to the field of ethics. The development of ethical standards is explored as related to the individual, government, business, and society. Contemporary social issues and personal ethical dilemmas are examined. Consequences of thinking and behaving ethically are analyzed.

PHIL 1450	Intro to World Religions	3	Alexandria Tech & Community College	06 – Humanities/Fine Arts 08 – Global Perspective	The course introduces learners to an overview of teachings, practices, beliefs, rituals, and influences of the five major world religions: Christianity, Islam, Hinduism, Judaism, and Buddhism. This course objectively presents each religion's perspective.
PLSC 1102	American Govt-Politics	3	Northland Community & Tech College	05 – Hist/Soc/Behav Sci 09 – Ethical/Civic Resp	This course is a study of the structure and functions of government at the national level and the relationship of the government to other social institutions and to the individual. Federalism, constitutionalism, interest groups, the media, parties and campaigns are among the topics that will be addressed. Prerequisites: None
PLSC 2202	International Relations	3	Northland Community & Tech College	05 – Hist/Soc/Behav Sci 08 – Global Perspective	This course acquaints students with general principles and processes operating in contemporary global politics. Considerable attention is devoted to current international affairs. Prerequisites: None
PRSW 1400	Introduction to Social Work	3	Alexandria Tech & Community College		Social work is a dynamic profession that strives to support, empower, and improve the lives of others. This course provides an overview of professional social work including its history, core values, Code of Ethics, fields of practice, levels of practice, major intervention methods, and the generalist approach. Students will develop skills in critical thinking, professional communication, self-awareness, and advocacy to prepare them for work in a diverse society.
PSYC 1405	Life Span Psychology	3	Alexandria Tech & Community College	05 – Hist/Soc/Behav Sci	This course surveys human development from the lifespan perspective including theories, stages, and influences of development. This course views the individual from conception to death through physical, social, emotional, and mental development.
PSYC 1410	Psychological Disorders	3	Alexandria Tech & Community College	05 – Hist/Soc/Behav Sci	This course covers the branch of psychology that addresses the description, causes, and treatment of abnormal behavior patterns. Psychological disorders are looked at from the medical model perspective and the psychological and sociocultural perspectives. Common disorders are included such as stress, anxiety disorders, mood disorders, personality disorders, schizophrenia, dissociative disorders, eating and sleeping disorders, substance abuse, and gender identity disorders.
PSYC 1445	General Psychology	3	Alexandria Tech & Community College	05 – Hist/Soc/Behav Sci	This course is a basic introduction to psychology. PTE 1510	Juvenile Justice	3	Alexandria Tech & Community College		This course emphasizes the origin, development, organization, functions, and jurisdiction of the Juvenile Justice System in the United States. The emphasis is on the MN Juvenile Justice System. Topic areas covered include processes and detention of juveniles; constitutional protections extended to juveniles; case disposition, juvenile statutes and court procedures relative to juvenile offenders; and laws and procedures regarding child abuse, child neglect, juvenile records, and the juvenile court process.

SGNL 1100	American Sign Language (ASL) I	4	Northwest Technical College	08 – Global Perspective	<p>This course is an introduction to American Sign Language (ASL), a visual/gestural language used by individuals with profound hearing impairment or deaf people.</p> <p>Students will develop practical skills and fundamental grammar knowledge required for successful interactions within the Deaf Community. Students will learn the ability to use sign language appropriately within a deaf cultural context.
