## Board Report September 19, 2016

## 1. What's new at CIHS?

- i. Back to School Activities on August 31<sup>st</sup> went well. Approximately 75% of the parents/students were in to pick up schedules, Chromebooks, etc. that day/evening. After Friday, September 2, there were less than 80 Chromebooks that needed to be picked up. All students had their Chromebook by Thursday, September 8!!

- iii. Wells Fargo has awarded C-I High School a \$1,000.00 "Community Connection" grant that will be used for the 7-12 PBIS program.
