PUBLIC LAW 108-446

Dressing for success is very important at Fleming. Much of Fleming's academic suc- cess stems from students coming to a school with few distractions. Students need to learn the importance of standing out of the crowd for meritorious achieve- ment rather than the style of clothes they are wearing. When your student must take prescription and non-prescription medicine please follow these steps: Parent/guardian must bring in the medication. The medicine must be in the original container. Parent/guardian must fill out appropriate forms with instructions/permission for the school to administer the medication. The parent/guardian must inform the school in writing of any changes in medication instructions. At no time may a student be in possession of either prescription or non-prescription medication while at school. All medications must be administered through the office. The only exceptions to this policy are students who must have inhalers, insulin, and epinephrine (bee sting) medications with them because of life threatening conditions. The office must be notified if your child is in this category. The District and State discourage parents from asking the schools to dispense non-prescription medication.
