During these meetings we individually looked at students' winter assessment scores, progress monitoring data, and made changes to intervention groups as needed. This is for both math and ELA. If student groups changed, parent letters were sent out right after break.• Based on winter assessment scores, 31 students require a Personal Reading Plan (PRP) per Act 20 requirements. From Fall to Winter testing, 4 students have met exit criteria and 7 students met entrance criteria.
