BOARD POLICY

Nonresident students admitted to the District will be subject to payment of tuition as established by the Board upon admission to the Tupelo Public School District. The Board authorizes the superintendent to establish tuition fees for nonresident students.

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURE

- 1. Tuition will be calculated by determining the local cost of educating a resident student plus any other related expenditure. Tuition charges will include a basic charge reflective of the amount of local funds provided toward the general educational expenses of resident students in grades K-8 and 9-12, respectively.

 1.1. Additional tuition charges will be assessed non-resident students for expenses related to educational services that create an additional economic burden on the local funding budget of the District. The scope of related services associated with educational expenses that place an added economic burden on the local funding budget and for which non-residents students may be charged additional tuition includes, but is not limited to the following:
 - special transportation
 - audiological services
 - psychological services
 - therapy: physical, occupational, aquatic, recreation (including therapeutic)
 - orientation and mobility services
 - assistive technology devices
 - social work
 - school health services
 - general counseling: parent counseling, parent training, rehabilitation counseling
 - early identification & assessment
 - professional development for staff
 - individualized instructional supplies/materials
 - gifted education services
- 1.2. Costs for the related services and items may vary.
- 2. The current tuition schedule shall be attached as an exhibit to this policy.

- 3. Nonresident students enrolling in the District for less than a full scholastic year will be assessed tuition on a pro-rata basis.
- 4. Students who enroll in the District without having first been properly granted a transfer by the Board will be subject to payment of annual tuition in an amount equal to the entire cost of educating a student in the District.
- 4. All tuition charges shall payments will be paid in advance. Tuition may be paid annually or by the semester.
- 5. A partial waiver of tuition may be requested by a nonresident student's parent or guardian who owns property in the District and pays local school taxes. The amount of a tuition waiver will be calculated by subtracting the amount actually paid in local school taxes from the amount annually assessed for nonresident tuition. Not more than one-half of the nonresident tuition will be considered for waiver per student. School taxes paid on property jointly owned with other parties or individuals will not be considered for waiver of tuition.
- 6. If at any time tuition payments become delinquent, the District reserves the right to rescind enrollment in the District and require the nonresident student to return to his/her home district. school of the student.

The basic tuition charges for non-resident students in grades K-8 and 9-12 are as listed and are due and payable in accordance with the following terms:

	Annually	Bi-Annually (per semester)
Grades K-8	1 @ \$518.00	2 @ \$272.00
Grades 9-12	1 @ \$600.00	2 @ \$316.00

- 1. The yearly payment plan requires that the annual tuition be paid in full prior to enrollment in school. The semester payment plan requires that payment be made in full prior to enrollment at the beginning of the semester.
- 2. Payment of tuition charges for educational expenses that place an added economic burden on the local funding budget shall be paid concurrent with the basic tuition charge. Should a non-resident student require related educational services, all expenses of such services will be assessed as part of his/her tuition. In the event that related services and expenses become known after payment of the basic tuition charge, such expenses shall be paid within 15 days of notice of such expenses given to the parents or legal guardians of the non-resident student.
