Parkrose Middle School SUN had another fun and enriching summer program this July! We served about 40 incoming 6th grade students from all 4 elementary schools. This was an excellent opportunity for these students to meet each other, and get acclimated to the building,

staff, and expectations. Each student left with a complete binder full of supplies to get a head start this fall. Students started the day with homeroom, where teachers implemented an AVID-based curriculum, including using iPads, having "lock battles" to be prepared for using a locker, and focusing on the components of ROCK (Respect, Organization, C Kind). We expanded this year to offer one 7th/8th grade homeroom and served close to 20 returning students. These students took on a leadership role and modeled appropriate middle school behavior, it was awesome to see! Thanks to our community partners, we provided an exciting daily activity block that offered unique experiences for students, including Coding Club, Guitar, Global Cooking, Science Club, and Field Games. We ended the summer with a celebratory "Meet and Greet", where families came to the middle school to meet staff and see first hand what summer SUN is all about. Close to 150 people attended and enjoyed lunch, a guitar class performance, summer slide show, cooking demonstration, and student-led school tours. It was a fun way to welcome parents to the building and showcase student's hard work and creativity. Another highlight of the summer was our food backpack program. About 12 families participated and received free groceries at the end of each week to combat weekend hunger. We made great connections and will continue this service during the school year.

Parkrose Boys & Girls Club summer program hosted at Russell served 70 youth per week on average with a total of 130 participants from incoming 1st-8th grade. Club ran June 20-August 19th on weekdays from 8:30am to 5:30pm. Each week included specialized program offerings ranging from soccer to wacky science to edible art to Google's CS First coding program, as well as a daily sessions of Summer Brain Gain--BGC's summer learning loss prevention curriculum. Once again our partnerships with both the Winterhawks and ZAP (Zoo Animal Presenters) teams provided exciting presentations and clinics in addition the the regular weekly programming. Our members also engaged in several out-of-club opportunities including Shop with a Cop (providing back to school clothes, backpacks, and school supplies), Girls Strong Soccer Clinic, and field trips to Thorns and Timbers game. Students enjoyed a week with high school volunteers from Resurrection Catholic Parish where they learned gardening skills to assist in taking care of the new Russell garden. In addition, every Tuesday in July and August, Elevate Oregon brought in a group of volunteers to run creative character-building games. It's certainly been a jam-packed summer!

Sacramento SUN served approximately 60 incoming 1st through 5th graders this summer, as well as 12 incoming kindergarteners in our EKT program. Our theme this summer was "SUN Around the World." Students spent four weeks exploring different regions of the globe, learning about art, music, games, and other aspects of culture from different countries. Additionally, we partnered with Elevate Oregon, who brought their program "Little Lift" to our 4th and 5th graders, as well as with Choi's (pronounced "Chay's") Taekwondo studio, who provided students with free taekwondo lessons. Students also got to try their hand at juggling with our volunteer juggling instructor, and even made their own juggling balls to take home! OMSI brought their Portable Planetarium for students to explore, and the Oregon Zoo's Waste Reduction Program presented a lesson on composting. The Multnomah County Library's Books 2 U program visited us twice, and helped incentive reading this summer. We held a SUN Showcase on the final day of program, where students were able to demonstrate their knowledge of various cultures to their families and community.
