## 11.A.2. Illinois Coal Workers and Communities in Transition Project Grant Discussion

Mr. Nick Stange noted a student, Emily Guske, reached out to him and brought an opportunity for Harlem and we could obtain some items and opportunities for students to do research, As a former student she came up through the documentary program and is part of the Climate Jobs Institute at U of I to help Illinois transition into clean energy for communities. So as we are seeing many closures of coal and power plants as they need to be closed by 2030 this will impact coalmines and impacts a rich history in coal for Illinois. To this day Illinois has the most recoverable coal reserves East of the Mississippi. We are talking about identifying many communities. This program is designed to go to these communities, listen and learn and then take the stories and use them through documentaries to help inform future communities that will see a similar thing. We can't revert back but change is happening. Coal has no demand. This group wants to look into this and help communities to transition and educate future generations. Kyra and myself and two students will go through the internship program to conduct this research, gather and make a documentary video about this. We need to take the documentaries to the people. The current timeline is from now to the end of June to purchase gear, starting to go with members of the team to visit different sites in the State and research and July through June

of next year start conducting and showing documentaries, we want to do the interviews. This will be a two year project choosing a senior and junior so there is a rollover over two years possibly which could turn into a three year project. The grant finances are paid up front for approximately \$20,000 after signing the agreements which will pay for gear and pay for travel so a lot of this is conducted on the weekends. Labor for our students that are participating in this will be paid to them. The second payment is \$84,000 for the calendar year after a progress report is put together for the first three months. This will be budgeted out for costs. Right now it is expected two female students so they can share a room. It is a great opportunity and a huge opportunity to be a part of the best school in Illinois U of I.

Mike asked about students being involved on weekends for interviews and the process of getting the students or criteria, and is there a chance it could be different genders. Nick noticed that we have made no final decisions but the ones we are considering want to pursue journalism. He is open to an applicant process as well. This would be a paid internship as well. The amount for the grant was done by Nick putting a budget together. Micki noted per Board approval her department will oversee all of the funding.

Kurt noted that this is fantastic and a former student bringing it back to the District is great.

Mr. Stange and Kyra Newnam noted if you come out May 17 Saturday, we will be doing screening of 10 student films in one day. There will be multiple screenings. This is top notch journalism.
