- **Business Professionals of America** We had two students place at the regional level. They participated in the State competition in Houston the week of March 3. Those students are Amanda Moses and Sparkle Dennis.
- **Anchor Club** The club attended the State convention in February. Emily Wilkerson was selected as the State President and Mrs. Abbott was named the State Advisor of the Year. The MHS club was named as the Outstanding Club in the State for 2013. Emily and one other member, as well as Mrs. Abbott, will be attending the international convention in Chicago in July.
- FCCLA The Family, Career, and Community Leaders of America organization competed at the regional level on March 1 in Irving. Tristan Mosher won first place in Entrepreneurship and Hannah Backer and Kayley Lantrip won 2nd place in National Programs in Action. These students, along with Mrs. Patty Hawkins, will be competing at the State competition in Corpus Christi in April. Stacy Melo was also elected as Region III Vice President of Programs.
- **Spring Sports** Tennis, track, baseball and softball are all preparing for district play and doing well. Baseball and softball have had three straight tournaments over the past three weeks.
