

November Board Report


Principals' Report:

Okii! It is amazing that October has already passed! We enjoy the opportunity to share the activities that have taken place at Napi Elementary School over the past month!

Attendance:

On October 20th, a total of 30 certified attendance letters were mailed to the parents of students who have missed 14 days or more of 1st quarter. Fourteen letters were mailed to 4th grade students and 16 letters were mailed to 5th grade students. Attendance letters were also mailed for students that have missed more than 9 days for the quarter. Twelve letters were mailed to 4th grade students and 14 letters were mailed to 5th grade students. Students that have missed more than 14 days will become students that Mr. Andreas will begin the Check In and Connect program with. This will include visiting the students Google Classrooms daily to check on their attendance, reach out if they aren't present, providing praise and incentives for improved attendance. Principals generated the 14 day letters and the teachers generated the 9 day letters. Napi's attendance for October did decrease, which we attribute to an increase in student or family illnesses, which are coded as medically excused. October attendance for 4th grade attendance was 79% and for 5th grade attendance was 77%. Copies of both attendance letters are attached below.

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1st Quarter Report Cards and Virtual Awards Assemblies

First quarter ended on October 28th. Napi Elementary Teachers hosted 1st quarter award assemblies on October 29th for all students. Students were awarded certificates for attendance, behavior, participation, and Student of the Quarter. Report cards will be mailed out the week of November 2, 2020. Parents and students attended together, so it was a great opportunity to praise students in front of their parents and peers. We thank all of the teachers for their work and effort to make students feel special and to recognize them for their hard work this quarter.

Technology:

Preparing Ipads for distribution will be the focus the week of November 2nd. We hope to have all Ipads prepared for distribution by November 6th. Our plan is to continue using chromebooks and schedule time daily for students and teachers to become familiar using the IPads. This approach will ensure that instruction and communication with our students continues. We are so thankful to the district and the Technology Department for all of their hard work in providing our students this technology!

Student Participation in Google Classroom Incentives

Napi wants to continue to celebrate the students that log into google classroom daily and participate in their education. We are looking at alternatives to providing incentives that don't encourage students to leave their homes during the Tribal Stay At Home Order. To date, we have created a certificate that is emailed to the students that they can redeem at the Napi School Store, once the Stay At Home Order is lifted. We have the store stocked with toys, school supplies items, food, and gift cards.


Red Ribbon Week at Napi




Native American Month and Project Learning at Napi




Parent and Community Communication

Coaches Report:

Can't believe October has passed, we have been so busy with many things such as walkthroughs, training sessions with our support staff, virtual coaching summit, and meeting with our math consultants. We started the month of October 7-8 in participating in a Virtual Coaching Summit with

Jill Jackson. We learned many different ways to help our teachers as instructional coaches. This training was very beneficial and a refresher for new and seasonal instructional coaches. It was interesting to hear what Jill Jackson said about "How instructional coaches can give guidance to the teachers and be available to observe and assist them when needed. Mrs. Bragg started her one to one coaching session last week.

During our extended Wednesdays the instructional coaches worked with the support staff on ELA frameworks, Zearn, and instructional strategies to ensure students are working through the activities that are assigned to them by their teachers.

We continue to do walkthroughs daily to observe the teachers' glows and grows in ELA and Math classes, as well as student's engagement in their google classroom. Teachers are doing quite well, and it is very impressive to see how the students and teachers are confident using google classroom, as the students learn and the teachers teach these subjects.

On October 20th we met with our math consultant Mary Buck from 8-12pm. We discussed how it is important that our students get the Succeed workbook that contains homework lessons for students to use during math class. We focused on the lessons for November and reviewed any current math data that may have needed attention from our consultant. We also adjust the pacing guides to meet our students' and teachers' needs regarding the lessons that were being taught. We met with our grade level teachers on these specific times to view and discuss each lesson to determine the guidual release of responsibility that will be used for each upcoming math lesson.

Counselor Report:

Red Ribbon Week is an opportunity for schools, community members, and various organizations to unite and take a visible stand against drugs. When people feel good about themselves, supported by others and connected to their community, they are less likely to make unhealthy choices. Spokinaapi believes in our community and that we can come together to build the self-esteem of our students and support one another in saying no to drugs by teaching students to have healthy coping skills and encouraging positivity to self and others.

As the Spokinaapi prevention specialist for Napi Elementary, I focused on age appropriate education. The major components included in the videos are the effects of drugs and alcohol on underage individuals, prevention, making healthy choices, ways to say no to peer pressure, and stress management tips.
