

Are you ready for the answer? **The number one thing parents can do to help their children learn to read is to read to them.** On one hand, this sounds simple. . .just pick up a book and read it with your child. On the other hand, more questions come to mind: when, where, how often, and with what books?

To the rescue comes the 8th edition of Jim Trelease's *Read-Aloud Handbook*. This million copy bestseller is for any adult wanting to help children become lifelong readers. It is full of how-tos for reading to children of all ages, and it includes a *Giant Treasury of Great Read-Aloud Books*.


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
