Neah-Kah-Nie Middle School Math Adoption, Angie Douma, Ruben Bitts and Katie Green
Ms. Green shared the results of the math pilot process that the middle school has gone through as they prepare to recommend a new math curriculum. They selected Carnegie's Middle School Math Curriculum. Ms. Green shared a budget of \$62,372.69 for the curriculum, which includes the cost of materials (print and digital), manipulatives and staff development. Discussion occurred.
