CRES Board Report: January 2017

CRES 2016-2017 Goals

- 100% of CRES students will demonstrate growth in Reading and Math as measured by the Spring, 2017 STAR Enterprise assessment
- CRES 3rd through 6th graders will score at or above the state average on the 2016
 Minnesota Comprehensive Assessments in math and reading
- CRES students will receive 25% fewer behavior reports for defiance and disrespect in 2016-17 than in 2015-16.
- CRES will increase parent involvement activities related to STEAM from zero in 2015-16 to 7 in 2016-17.
- The 6th grade STEAM Expo took place on the morning of January 12th. The students did a great job with their STEAM projects, their visual arts projects, and their music. The next Expo will be at 7:00 pm, and it will feature our 2nd graders.
- "Magic Toby" came to CRES on January 5th to entertain the 4th, 5th, and 6th graders, and to send a great anti-bullying message to the students. As usual, the students were great audience members.
- A date for our Books and Bingo activity has been tentatively set for March 2nd. This great event, which is now in its 3rd year, gives parents and children an opportunity to share an evening of bingo, food, and tips on how to become better readers. Each child can even leave the event with a new book to add to their personal library.
- Year-to-date, we have seen a 24% decrease in the number of major incident reports and a 25% decrease in the number of minor incident reports at CRES when compared to 2015-2016. About 84% of our students have not received any incident reports this year.
